#### 1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to the Century Commission for a 3 Sustainable Florida; amending s. 163.3247, F.S.; revising 4 provisions relating to the Century Commission for a 5 Sustainable Florida; revising the findings and intent to 6 include the necessity for a specific strategic plan 7 addressing the state's growth management system; revising 8 the planning timeframes to include a 10-year horizon; 9 revising membership of the commission; deleting obsolete 10 provisions regarding initial appointments; providing for 11 the election of a chair and excluding certain members from serving as chair during a specified period; requiring that 12 the commission meet at least six times per fiscal year; 13 14 deleting a provision that requires the commission to meet 15 in different regions in the state; requiring that the 16 executive director establish a meeting calendar with the 17 commission's approval; authorizing the commission to form subcommittees by vote; providing for a majority vote of 18 19 members on commission actions; providing for reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses; revising provisions 20 21 relating to the commission's powers and duties; requiring 22 that the commission, in cooperation with interested state 23 agencies, local governments, and nongovernmental 24 stakeholders, develop a strategic plan and submit the plan 25 to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date; 26 requiring that the commission also submit progress reports 27 by specified dates; requiring that the commission make 28 presentations to the Governor and the Legislature;

29 providing that an executive director be appointed by the 30 Secretary of Community Affairs and ratified by the 31 commission; requiring that the Department of Community 32 Affairs provide a specific line item in its annual 33 legislative budget request to fund the commission during a 34 specified period; authorizing the department to obtain 35 additional funding through external grants; requiring that 36 the department provide sufficient funding and staff 37 support to assist the commission in its duties; providing 38 for future expiration and the abolishment of the 39 commission; providing an effective date.

41 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

43 Section 1. Section 163.3247, Florida Statutes, as amended 44 by section 42 of chapter 2010-153, Laws of Florida, is amended, 45 and subsection (6) is added to that section, to read:

163.3247 Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida.-(1) POPULAR NAME.-This section may be cited as the

48 "Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida Act."

49 FINDINGS AND INTENT.-The Legislature finds and (2)50 declares that the population of this state is expected to more 51 than double over the next 100 years, with commensurate impacts 52 to the state's natural resources and public infrastructure. 53 Consequently, it is in the best interests of the people of the 54 state to ensure sound planning for the proper placement of this 55 growth and protection of the state's land, water, and other 56 natural resources since such resources are essential to our

57 collective quality of life and a strong economy. The state's 58 growth management system should foster economic stability through regional solutions and strategies, urban renewal and 59 infill, and the continued viability of agricultural economies, 60 61 while allowing for rural economic development and protecting the 62 unique characteristics of rural areas, and should reduce the 63 complexity of the regulatory process while carrying out the 64 intent of the laws and encouraging greater citizen 65 participation. The Legislature further finds that it is imperative that the state have a specific strategic plan 66 67 addressing its growth management system. 68 CENTURY COMMISSION FOR A SUSTAINABLE FLORIDA; (3) 69 CREATION; ORGANIZATION.-The Century Commission for a Sustainable 70 Florida is created as a standing body to help the citizens of 71 this state envision and plan their collective future with an eye 72 towards 10-year, both 25-year, and 50-year horizons. 73 The commission shall consist of 18 15 members (a) 74 appointed as follows:  $\tau$ 75 1. Two members  $\frac{5}{7}$  appointed by the Governor; 76 Five members  $\frac{5}{2}$  appointed by the President of the 2. 77 Senate; , and 3. 78 Five members 5 appointed by the Speaker of the House of 79 Representatives; 4. 92	Beginning July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2013, one member shall

(c) (b) The fiscal year of the commission begins July 1 114 115 each year and ends June 30 of the following year. The first 116 meeting of The commission shall be held no later than December 117 1, 2005, and shall meet at the call of the chair but not less 118 frequently than six three times per fiscal year in different 119 regions of the state to solicit input from the public or any 120 other individuals offering testimony relevant to the issues to be considered. The executive director shall establish a meeting 121 calendar for the fiscal year which considers the availability of 122 123 members. The commission must vote to approve the meeting 124 calendar before the beginning of the fiscal year. The commission 125 may vote to form subcommittees and schedule meetings as 126 necessary.

127 <u>(d) (c)</u> Each member of the commission is entitled to one 128 vote, and <u>the</u> actions of the commission are not binding unless 129 taken by a <u>majority three-fifths</u> vote of the members present. A 130 majority of the members is required to constitute a quorum, and 131 the affirmative vote of a quorum is required for a binding vote.

132 <u>(e) (d)</u> Members of the commission shall serve without 133 compensation, but <u>are shall be entitled to receive reimbursement</u> 134 <u>for per diem and travel expenses as provided</u> in <del>accordance with</del> 135 s. 112.061 while in the performance of their duties.

(b) Continuously review and consider statutory and regulatory provisions, governmental processes, and societal and economic trends in its inquiry of how state, regional, and local governments and entities and citizens of this state can best accommodate projected increased populations while maintaining the natural, historical, cultural, and manmade life qualities that best represent the state.

149 (c) bring together people representing varied interests to develop a shared image of the state and its developed and 150 151 natural areas. The process should involve exploring the impact 152 of the estimated population increase and other emerging trends and issues; creating a vision for the future; and developing a 153 154 strategic action plan to achieve that vision using 10-year, 25year, and 50-year intermediate planning timeframes. The plan 155 156 must:

157  $\underline{1.(d)}$  Focus on essential state interests, defined as those 158 interests that transcend local or regional boundaries and are 159 most appropriately conserved, protected, and promoted at the 160 state level;-

161 <u>2. Accommodate the projections for an increase in</u> 162 <u>population while maintaining the state's natural, historical,</u> 163 <u>cultural, and manmade life qualities; and</u>

169 progress reports by November 15, 2011, and March 15, 2012. The 170 commission shall also make presentations, at least annually, to 171 the Governor and the Legislature.

(e) Serve as an objective, nonpartisan repository of exemplary community-building ideas and as a source to recommend strategies and practices to assist others in working collaboratively to problem solve on issues relating to growth management.

177 (f) Annually, beginning January 16, 2007, and every year 178 thereafter on the same date, provide to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 179 180 Representatives a written report containing specific 181 recommendations for addressing growth management in the state, 182 including executive and legislative recommendations. Further, 183 the report shall contain discussions regarding the need for 184 intergovernmental cooperation and the balancing of environmental 185 protection and future development and recommendations on issues, 186 including, but not limited to, recommendations regarding 187 dedicated sources of funding for sewer facilities, water supply 188 and quality, transportation facilities that are not adequately 189 addressed by the Strategic Intermodal System, and educational 190 infrastructure to support existing development and projected 191 population growth.

192 (c) (g) Beginning with the 2007 Regular Session of the 193 Legislature, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 194 House of Representatives shall create a joint select committee, 195 the task of which shall be to review the findings and 196 recommendations of the Century Commission for a Sustainable

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; STAFF AND OTHER ASSISTANCE.-198 (5) 199 The Secretary of Community Affairs shall select An (a) 200 executive director shall be appointed by the Secretary of 201 Community Affairs and ratified by the commission and of the 202 commission, and the executive director shall serve at the 203 pleasure of the secretary under the supervision and control of 204 the commission under the direction of the chair.

205 (b) The Department of Community Affairs shall provide a 206 specific line item in its annual legislative budget request to 207 fund the commission for the period beginning July 1, 2011, 208 through June 30, 2013. The department may obtain additional 209 funding through external grants. The department shall provide 210 sufficient funds and staff support for the purpose of assisting 211 the commission in completing the strategic plan staff and other 212 resources necessary to accomplish the goals of the commission 213 based upon recommendations of the Governor.

(c) All agencies under the control of the Governor are
directed, and all other agencies are requested, to render
assistance to, and cooperate with, the commission.

217 (6) EXPIRATION.—This section expires and the commission is 218 abolished June 30, 2013.
