A bill to be entitled

An act relating to disability awareness; amending s. 1003.4205, F.S.; requiring district school boards to provide disability history and awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools during the first week in October; requiring certified individuals in disability awareness or teachers who specialize in exceptional student education to provide the disability history and awareness instruction; requiring the Governor's Commission on Disabilities to initiate a study on training in disability awareness to be conducted by a private nonprofit entity; providing requirements for the study and requiring submission of findings to the commission; requiring the commission to oversee a statewide program for providers of training in disability awareness; providing program components to include requirements for approval of providers and certification of individuals who provide instruction in disability awareness; providing for the payment of certain fees; requiring the commission to promote training in disability awareness in all public entities in the state; requiring the commission to encourage those public entities to participate in activities that provide instruction to expand knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals who have disabilities; requiring the commission to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1003.4205, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.4205 Disability history and awareness instruction.-

- (1) Each district school board  $\underline{shall}$   $\underline{may}$  provide disability history and awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools in the district during the first  $\underline{week}$   $\underline{2}$   $\underline{weeks}$  in October each year. The district school board shall designate  $\underline{this}$   $\underline{week}$   $\underline{these}$   $\underline{2}$   $\underline{weeks}$  as "Disability History and Awareness Week  $\underline{Weeks}$ ."
- (2) (a) During this 1-week 2-week period, students shall may be provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals with disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability rights movement. Disability history must may include the events and timelines of the development and evolution of services to, and the civil rights of, individuals with disabilities. Disability history must may also include the contributions of specific individuals with disabilities, including the contributions of acknowledged national leaders.
- (b) The instruction shall may be integrated into the existing school curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other school-related activities. Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, the instruction must may be delivered by individuals who are certified to provide instruction in disability awareness qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable guest speakers, with a particular focus on including individuals who have with disabilities as instructors, or by teachers who are currently employed at a school and who

specialize in exceptional student education at the school.

(3) The goals of disability history and awareness instruction include:

- (a) Better treatment for individuals  $\underline{\text{who have}}$   $\underline{\text{with}}$  disabilities, especially for youth in school, and increased attention to preventing the bullying or harassment of students who have  $\underline{\text{with}}$  disabilities.
- (b) Encouragement to individuals who have with disabilities to develop increased self-esteem, resulting in more individuals who have with disabilities gaining pride in being an individual with a disability, obtaining postsecondary education, entering the workforce, and contributing to their communities.
- (c) Reaffirmation of the local, state, and federal commitment to the full inclusion in society of, and the equal opportunity for, all individuals who have with disabilities.

Section 2. <u>Disability awareness training standards</u>, protocol, and curriculum; certification.—

- (1) The Governor's Commission on Disabilities shall initiate a study regarding training in disability awareness beginning July 1, 2011, to be conducted by a private nonprofit entity that promotes disability awareness in the classroom and the community at large and provides training in disability awareness. State agencies and programs shall cooperate with the private nonprofit entity as it conducts the study to establish training standards, protocol, and curriculum with regard to disability awareness. Within the study, the private nonprofit entity shall:
- (a) Evaluate and recommend to the commission standards and criteria necessary for authorizing providers to conduct training

in disability awareness.

(b) Establish guidelines and curriculum for a certification program for disability awareness instructors.

(c) Provide to the commission a summary of the current trends in training in disability awareness.

The private nonprofit entity conducting the study shall submit its findings to the commission by July 1, 2011.

(2) Beginning July 1, 2012, the commission shall oversee a statewide program for providers of training and certified instructors in disability awareness which includes, but is not limited to, the following components:

(a) A training provider must meet all criteria established and published by the commission in order to be approved to conduct continuing education courses for certifying individuals as instructors in disability awareness. A provider may charge a service fee for the continuing education courses in an amount that is sufficient to cover its costs in providing the courses.

(b) In order to be approved by the commission, a provider of training in disability awareness must have a minimum of 5 years of experience working in the field of disabilities, submit an application to the commission to provide training in disability awareness, pay an application or renewal fee set by the commission not to exceed \$200, and submit an annual report to the commission which documents the provider's training activities. An approved provider shall renew its approved status with the commission every 3 years.

(c) An approved provider shall use the commission's approved training methods and curriculum materials for

117 conducting continuing education courses.

(d) The commission shall publish and make available to the public a list of providers approved to offer training for certifying individuals as instructors in disability awareness.

- (e) An individual seeking certification to provide instruction in disability awareness shall participate in continuing education courses conducted by a commission-approved provider. The commission shall certify an individual as an instructor who successfully completes the required continuing education courses in disability awareness. This individual shall pay a certification or certification renewal fee set by the commission not to exceed \$100, and the certified individual shall renew certification with the commission every 3 years.
- of, and the equal opportunity for, individuals who have disabilities through training in disability awareness in all public entities in the state. The commission shall encourage those public entities to participate in activities that provide instruction to expand knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals who have disabilities, the history of disability awareness, and the disability rights movement.
- (4) The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54, Florida Statutes, to administer this section.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
