65 (5) Basin board members shall serve without receive no 66 compensation for services as such; but are entitled to 67 reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 68 112.061, while officially on work for the district, they shall 69 receive their actual travel expenses between their respective 70 places of residence and the place where official district 71 business is conducted, subsistence, lodging, and other expenses 72 in the amount actually incurred. The 90 chair shall be the liaison officer of the district in all 91 affairs in the basin and shall be kept informed of all such 92 affairs.

93 (c) If a vacancy occurs on a basin board, a quorum of the 94 total remaining members may continue to transact official 95 business until a successor is appointed.
