A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the trading of water quality credits; amending s. 403.067, F.S.; providing that state policy is to encourage a water quality credit trading program through public-private partnerships; expanding an existing water quality credit trading pilot program in the Lower St. Johns River Basin to include the Caloosahatchee, St. Lucie, and Lake Okeechobee Basins; requiring the South Florida Water Management District to define the basins; requiring that the water management district coordinate with the Department of Environmental Protection to establish public-private partnerships for the development of water quality enhancement projects and trading programs in the designated basins; removing references to the Lower St. Johns River Basin pilot project; requiring the department to amend its rules; deleting a reporting requirement relating to the effectiveness of the Lower St. Johns River Basin pilot project; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Present paragraphs (a) through (g) of subsection (8) of section 403.067, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (b) through (h), respectively, a new paragraph (a) is added to that subsection, and subsection (10) of that section is amended, to read:

403.067 Establishment and implementation of total maximum

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daily loads.-

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- (8) WATER QUALITY CREDIT TRADING.-
- (a) It is the policy of this state to encourage a robust water quality credit trading program through public-private partnerships because the trading of water quality credits can lead to increased environmental benefits at reduced costs to the state.
- (10) PILOT PROGRAMS.—Water quality credit trading shall be limited to the Lower St. Johns River Basin, the Caloosahatchee Basin, the St. Lucie Basin, and the Lake Okeechobee Basin. The Caloosahatchee, St. Lucie, and Lake Okeechobee Basins shall be defined by the South Florida Water Management District. The South Florida Water Management District shall coordinate with the department to establish public-private partnerships for the development of water quality enhancement projects and water quality trading programs for such projects in the designated basins. as defined by the department, as a pilot project. The department may authorize water quality credit trading and establish specific requirements for trading in the adopted basin management action plan for the Lower St. Johns River Basin prior to the adoption of rules under paragraph (9)(c) in order to effectively implement the pilot project. Entities that participate in water quality credit trades shall timely report to the department the prices for credits, how the prices were determined, and any state funding received for the facilities or activities that generated the credits. The department may shall not participate in the establishment of credit prices. The department shall amend the rules adopted pursuant to paragraph (9)(c) to implement pilot programs for the Caloosahatchee, St.
