This act may be cited as the "Student Advisory 25 in Educational Governance Act."

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Section 2. Section 1001.205, Florida Statutes, is created

(1) The Florida Educational Student Advisory Council (FESAC) is created within the Department of Education.

- (2) Each district school board shall establish a screening committee to select five applicants from its respective school district who are capable of serving on the FESAC. A student interested in serving on the FESAC shall submit an application, developed by the State Board of Education, and all of the following to the school district screening committee:
 - (a) A resume.

- (b) Letters of endorsement from the student's high school advisory council and from a local governmental official.
- (c) A 10-page portfolio of community service projects performed since the student's first year in high school.
- $\underline{\mbox{(d)}}$ A 1000-word essay on what the student will do as a member of the FESAC.
- (e) A 5-page proposal on any issue affecting the Florida public school system.
- (3) Each school district screening committee, upon approval of the district school board, shall submit five student applications along with the information required in paragraphs (2)(a)-(e) to the Department of Education by April 1.
 - (4) (a) The FESAC shall be composed of the following:
- 1. Five students appointed by the Governor from nominees submitted by the school district screening committees.
- 2. Five students appointed by the President of the Senate from nominees submitted by the school district screening committees.

3. Five students appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives from nominees submitted by the school district screening committees.

- 4. Five students appointed by the President of the Florida School Boards Association, Inc., from district school board student advisors, pursuant to s. 1001.454, who have submitted to the association an application that is developed by the association.
- 5. Five students appointed by the President of the Florida
 Association of Student Councils from applicants who have
 submitted to the association an application that is developed by the association.
- (b) Each applicant must be enrolled in a Florida public high school and maintain his or her enrollment throughout service on the FESAC.
- (c) Members appointed by the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve 2-year terms and may not be reappointed. Members appointed by the President of the Florida School Boards

 Association, Inc., and the President of the Florida Association of Student Councils shall serve 1-year terms and may be reappointed for one additional term.
- (d) Vacancies shall be filled by the respective appointing authority from the applications previously submitted for that term.
- (5) The FESAC shall elect a chair and vice chair from its membership at its first quarterly meeting each term.

(a) The chair shall preside over all meetings of the FESAC and attend all State Board of Education meetings. The chair shall advise the State Board of Education on behalf of the FESAC at state board meetings.

- (b) In the chair's absence, the vice chair shall perform the duties described in paragraph (a).
 - (6) The FESAC shall:

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- (a) Meet quarterly in Tallahassee and hold regional meetings once a month in regions established by the State Board of Education.
- (b) Advise the Governor, the State Board of Education, and the Commissioner of Education on educational issues and student concerns.
- (c) Annually make policy recommendations to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives prior to the regular legislative session.
 - (7) The FESAC may adopt bylaws to govern its operations.
- (8) The regions established by the State Board of Education shall operate as committees of the FESAC.
- (a) Each region shall elect a chair and vice chair at the first monthly meeting each term. The chair shall preside over all meetings of the respective region. The vice chair shall preside in the absence of the chair.
 - (b) Each region may adopt bylaws to govern its operations.
- (9) A term of the FESAC shall begin on July 1 and end on June 30 each year. The first term of the FESAC shall begin on July 1, 2013.

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(10) Members of the FESAC shall serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061.

- Section 3. Section 1001.454, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 1001.454 Student advisory program; association of student councils.—
 - (1) By July 1, 2013, each district school board shall:
- (a) Establish a student advisory program which shall include a student advisor to the district school board and may include an assistant student advisor to the district school board, collectively known as the student advisors to the district school board.
- (b) Designate a districtwide association of student councils to voice the views and opinions of the students in the school district and to conduct districtwide projects. The association shall consist of all secondary schools in the district, represented by their student councils or student governments. The association shall elect the student advisors to the district school board at a meeting of the association designated by the district school board, with each school in attendance casting one vote. The district school superintendent shall assign one staff member to work with the association.
- (2) District school boards and district school superintendents are encouraged to include students on school district advisory councils, pursuant to s. 1001.452, who shall be appointed by the student advisors to the district school board.

(3) A district school board and the association of student
councils may adopt rules governing the district's student
advisory program and the participation of student advisors in
school district activities and decisionmaking.
Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
