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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Minor Traffic Safety Act."

- Section 2. Section 316.0075, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 316.0075 Operator use of commercial mobile radio services and electronic communications devices.—
- (1) Regulation of operator or passenger use of commercial mobile radio services and other electronic communications devices in a motor vehicle is expressly preempted to the state.
- (2) (a) A person who has not attained 18 years of age and is driving or in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on the roads of this state may not use any type of hand-held cellular telephone or other hand-held electronic communications device.
- (b) A person who is driving or in actual physical control of a school bus transporting any student to a public or private school on the roads of this state may not use any type of handheld cellular telephone or other hand-held electronic communications device.
 - (c) This subsection does not apply:
- 1. To a device that is designed for hands-free use and the person is using it in that manner.
- 2. When the motor vehicle is stopped and the engine is not running.
- (d) A violation of this subsection is a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation as provided in chapter 318.

- (1) Except as provided in ss. 318.17 and 320.07(3)(c), any person cited for a violation of chapter 316, s. 320.0605, s. 320.07(3)(a) or (b), s. 322.065, s. 322.144(2), s. 322.15(1), s. 322.16(2), or (3), or (4), s. 322.1615, s. 322.19, or s. 1006.66(3) is charged with a noncriminal infraction and must be cited for such an infraction and cited to appear before an official. If another person dies as a result of the noncriminal infraction, the person cited may be required to perform 120 community service hours under s. 316.027(4), in addition to any
- Section 4. Subsection (7) of section 322.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 322.08 Application for license; requirements for license and identification card forms.—
- (7) The application form for an original, renewal, or replacement driver's license or identification card shall include language permitting the following:
- (a) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which contribution shall be deposited into the Health Care Trust Fund for organ and tissue donor education and for maintaining the organ and tissue donor registry.
- (b) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which contribution shall be distributed to the Florida Council of the Blind.

(c) A voluntary contribution of \$2 per applicant, which shall be distributed to the Hearing Research Institute, Incorporated.

- (d) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation International.
- (e) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to the Children's Hearing Help Fund.
- (f) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to Family First, a nonprofit organization.

- (j) A voluntary contribution of \$1 to the Ronald McDonald House, which shall be distributed each month to Ronald McDonald House Charities of Tampa Bay, Inc.
- (k) Notwithstanding s. 322.081, a voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to the League Against Cancer/La Liga Contra el Cancer, a not-for-profit organization.
 - (1) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant to

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Prevent Child Sexual Abuse, which shall be distributed to Lauren's Kids, Inc., a nonprofit organization.

- (m) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to Prevent Blindness Florida, a not-for-profit organization, to prevent blindness and preserve the sight of the residents of this state.
- (n) Notwithstanding s. 322.081, a voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant to the state homes for veterans, to be distributed on a quarterly basis by the department to the State Homes for Veterans Trust Fund, which is administered by the Department of Veterans' Affairs.
- (o) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant to the Disabled American Veterans, Department of Florida, which shall be distributed quarterly to Disabled American Veterans, Department of Florida, a nonprofit organization.
- (p) A voluntary contribution of \$1 per applicant, which shall be distributed to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a nonprofit organization.

A statement providing an explanation of the purpose of the trust funds shall also be included. For the purpose of applying the service charge provided in s. 215.20, contributions received under paragraphs $\underline{(b)-(p)}$ $\underline{(b)-(o)}$ are not income of a revenue nature.

Section 5. Section 322.144, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

322.144 Identifying placards for minors.-

(1) When the department issues or reissues a license for the operation of motor vehicles to a person who has not attained 18 years of age, the department shall also issue to the person a placard that can be placed in a motor vehicle so as to be visible from the front and rear of the vehicle. Each side of the placard shall have markings or color which shall be obviously separate and distinct from all other placards issued by the department and shall bear a warning that the person must display the placard at all times while operating a motor vehicle.

- (2) A driver who has not attained 18 years of age must display the placard issued under this section at all times while operating a motor vehicle. The placard must be displayed so as to be visible from the front and rear of the vehicle.
- (3) A person who violates subsection (2) commits a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation as provided in chapter 318.
- Section 6. Subsections (4), (5), and (6) of section 322.16, Florida Statutes, are amended and renumbered as subsections (5), (6), and (7), respectively, and a new subsection (4) is added to that section, to read:
 - 322.16 License restrictions.-

- (4) A person who holds a driver's license who is under 18 years of age may not operate a motor vehicle with more than one passenger in the vehicle who is under 18 years of age, unless any additional passenger or passengers under 18 years of age are siblings or children of the driver, whether related by the whole or half blood, by affinity, or by adoption.
 - (5) (4) The department may, upon receiving satisfactory

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evidence of any violation of the restriction upon such a license, except a violation of paragraph (1)(d), subsection (2), or subsection (3), or subsection (4), suspend or revoke the license, but the licensee is entitled to a hearing as upon a suspension or revocation under this chapter.

 $\underline{(6)}$ It is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any manner in violation of the restrictions imposed under paragraph (1)(c).

(7)(6) Any person who operates a motor vehicle in violation of the restrictions imposed under paragraph (1)(a), paragraph (1)(b), subsection (2), or subsection (3), or subsection (4) commits a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as will be charged with a moving violation as provided in and fined in accordance with chapter 318.

Section 7. This act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
