23	unintended pregnancies and plan for pregnancy when they do want
24	to have a child, and publicly funded contraceptive services and
25	supplies prevent nearly two million unintended pregnancies each

27	WHEREAS, nearly half of all unintended pregnancies end in
28	abortion and abortion rates in the United States increase during

36 WHEREAS, in addition to the primary purpose of allowing 37 women to plan and prepare for pregnancy, other health benefits 38 of contraception include reduced risk of endometrial and ovarian 39 cancers, ectopic pregnancies, iron deficiency anemia related to 40 heavy menstruation, osteoporosis, ovarian cysts, and pelvic 41 inflammatory disease, and

WHEREAS, a majority of American voters believe that matters related to women's reproductive rights, including contraception and abortion, are personal issues that should be decided by women and their families, health care providers, and clergy members, and
