The State Board of Education, in cooperation with 50 the Department of Health, shall adopt rules for such use of 51 52 epinephrine auto-injectors that shall include provisions to 53 protect the safety of all students from the misuse or abuse of 54 auto-injectors. A school district, county health department, 55 public-private partner, and their employees and volunteers shall 56 be indemnified by the parent of a student authorized to carry an epinephrine auto-injector for any and all liability with respect 57 58 to the student's use of an epinephrine auto-injector pursuant to 59 this paragraph.
