Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Section 220.197, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
  - 220.197 Employment of former felons tax credit.-
- (1) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2013, a tax credit of \$1,000 shall be allowed to a corporation against any corporate income tax due under this chapter if the corporation hires a person who has been convicted of a felony in this state and released from confinement and who remains continuously employed by the corporation for at least 1 year. The tax credit may be taken only once per new employee.
- (2) The tax credit under this section is not available for employment of a person who is:
- (a) Classified as a violent career criminal, habitual felony offender, habitual violent felony offender, or three-time violent felony offender under s. 775.084.
- (b) Subject to registration as a sexual predator under s. 775.21.
- (c) Subject to registration as a sexual offender under s. 943.0435.
