The district school board shall designate these 2 weeks as 30 "Disability History and Awareness Weeks." <u>The Department of</u> 31 <u>Education shall assist in creating the curriculum for the</u> 32 <u>disability history and awareness instruction that will be used</u> 33 in each school district.

34 During this 2-week period, students shall may be (2) (a) 35 provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge, 36 understanding, and awareness of individuals who have with 37 disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability rights movement. Disability history must may include the events 38 39 and timelines of the development and evolution of services to, 40 and the civil rights of, individuals who have with disabilities. 41 Disability history must may also include the contributions of specific individuals who have with disabilities, including the 42 contributions of acknowledged national leaders. 43

44 (b) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, the instruction shall may be integrated into the existing school 45 curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing 46 47 lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other school-related activities. The instruction shall may be 48 49 delivered by individual presenters who have disabilities and who 50 have been approved by the Department of Education as presenters 51 qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable quest speakers, 52 with a particular focus on including individuals with 53 disabilities.

54 <u>(c)1. The Department of Education shall establish a</u> 55 <u>disability history and awareness advisory council. The council</u>

81	2. The department shall provide a liaison to assist the
82	council in its operation. The department shall act as the fiscal
83	agent for all financial transactions required by the council.
84	3. The responsibilities of the council shall be, but are
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85	not limited to:
86	a. Ensuring that each presenter has first-hand knowledge
87	and experience pertaining to the challenges facing individuals
88	who have disabilities;
89	b. Ensuring that each presenter meets the requirements of
90	s. 1012.465, the Jessica Lunsford Act, in the county in which
91	the presenter shall instruct; and
92	c. Submitting an annual report to the Governor, the
93	President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
94	Representatives, and the superintendent of each school district
95	in this state.
96	4. The council shall meet at least twice a year and more
97	often as needed.
98	(3) The goals of disability history and awareness
99	instruction include:
100	(a) Better treatment for individuals <u>who have</u> <del>with</del>
101	disabilities, especially for youth in school, and increased
102	attention to preventing the bullying or harassment of students
103	who have with disabilities.
104	(b) Encouragement to individuals who have with
105	disabilities to develop increased self-esteem, resulting in more
106	individuals <u>who have</u> <del>with</del> disabilities gaining pride in being an
107	individual with a disability, obtaining postsecondary education,
108	entering the workforce, and contributing to their communities.
109	(c) Reaffirmation of the local, state, and federal
110	commitment to the full inclusion in society of, and the equal
111	opportunity for, all individuals <u>who have</u> <del>with</del> disabilities.
