Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Section 486.0715, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 486.0715 Physical therapist; issuance of temporary permit.-(1) A temporary permit to practice as a physical therapist may be granted to an applicant who graduates from a physical therapy program in the United States recognized by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education, subject to the following requirements: A temporary permit shall be granted to an applicant (a) upon his or her graduation date and shall remain in effect until the results of the National Physical Therapy Examination are released and published. If the applicant receives a passing score, he or she may continue to practice as a physical therapist with a temporary permit until a license is granted at the next available meeting of the board. A temporary permit is void if a passing score on the National Physical Therapy
