I. Summary:

This bill designates April 4 of each year as "Everglades Day."

The bill creates section 683.185, of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Chapter 683, F.S., contains the legal holidays and special observances commemorated in Florida's statutes. In addition to the legal holidays denoted in s. 683.01, F.S., there are more than 30 special observances recognized to date. These special observances commemorate a variety of persons, events or religious observances including teachers, retired teachers, Ann Arbor Day, Ronald Reagan Day, I am an American Day, Yom Kippur, Rosh Hashanah, Good Friday, and Florida's Missing Children Day.

The Florida Everglades is one of the largest wetlands in the world.⁴ It supplies water to one in three Floridians.⁵ The Florida Everglades draw over 1 million visitors annually and serve an important role in the tourism, agricultural, real estate and recreational industries in the state.⁶

The Florida Everglades once spanned from Lake Okeechobee to Florida Bay. Due to subsequent environmental degradation, it has become the subject of one of the biggest ecological restoration efforts ever undertaken. But a subject of one of the biggest ecological restoration efforts ever undertaken.

This bill recognizes the importance of the Florida Everglades by creating a special observance of the Everglades on April 4 of each year. The Florida Everglades has been designated an International Biosphere Reserve, a World Heritage Site, and a Wetland of International Importance. The Florida Everglades will celebrate its 70th anniversary in 2012.
