- (1) The district school superintendent shall requisition adopted instructional materials from the depository of the publisher with whom a contract has been made. However, the superintendent shall requisition current instructional materials to provide each student with a textbook or other materials as a major tool of instruction in core courses of the subject areas specified in s. 1006.40(2). These materials must be requisitioned within the first $\frac{4}{2}$ years of the adoption cycle, except for instructional materials related to growth of student membership or instructional materials maintenance needs. The superintendent may requisition instructional materials in the core subject areas specified in s. 1006.40(2) that are related to growth of student membership or instructional materials maintenance needs during the $\frac{3rd}{4th}$, $\frac{3rd}{4th}$,
- Section 3. Subsections (12) and (13) of section 1006.38, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 1006.38 Duties, responsibilities, and requirements of instructional materials publishers and manufacturers.—Publishers and manufacturers of instructional materials, or their representatives, shall:
- (12) For the core subject areas specified in s. 1006.40(2), maintain in the depository for the first $\underline{4}$ 2 years of the contract an inventory of instructional materials sufficient to receive and fill orders.

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1006.40(2), ensure the availability of an inventory sufficient to receive and fill orders for instructional materials for growth, including the opening of a new school, and replacement during the <u>5th year</u> 3rd and subsequent years of the original contract period.

- (2) Each district school board must purchase current instructional materials to provide each student with a major tool of instruction in core courses of the subject areas of mathematics, language arts, science, social studies, reading, and literature for kindergarten through grade 12. Such purchase must be made within the first $\underline{4}$ 2 years after the effective date of the adoption cycle.
- (4) The funds described in subsection (3) which district school boards may use to purchase materials not on the state-adopted list shall be used for the purchase of instructional materials or other items having intellectual content that is aligned to the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. These instructional materials or other items shall be used instead of instructional materials on the state-adopted list which provide instruction in the core courses pursuant to subsection (2) which assist in the instruction of a subject or course. These instructional materials or other items may be available in bound, unbound, kit, or package form and may consist of

hardbacked or softbacked textbooks, electronic content, replacements for items which were part of previously purchased instructional materials, consumables, learning laboratories, manipulatives, electronic media, computer courseware or software, and other commonly accepted instructional tools as prescribed by district school board rule.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.

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
