A bill to be entitled

An act relating to supplier diversity; providing that the purpose of the act is to encourage greater economic opportunity for businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans; providing definitions; authorizing the Public Service Commission to require certain regulated corporations to submit a plan for increasing procurement from businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans; providing criteria for procurement programs; authorizing the commission to establish guidelines for procurement programs; requiring certain regulated corporations to report annually to the commission on the implementation of procurement programs; requiring the commission to annually report certain information to the Legislature; encouraging certain corporations to voluntarily adopt such plans; authorizing the commission to adopt rules to determine and verify the eligibility for participation in the procurement program; requiring that affected regulated corporations implement an outreach program; providing penalties for a person or corporation that falsely represents a business being controlled or operated by women, minorities, or disabled veterans; providing that a corporation may take certain measures to facilitate the participation of businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, or disabled veterans; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the opportunity for full participation in our free enterprise system by businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans is essential if this state is to attain economic equality for those businesses and improve the functioning of the entire state economy, and

WHEREAS, public agencies and some regulated utilities that have established short- and long-range goals for contracting with businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans are awarding 30 percent or more of their contracts to these business enterprises, and

WHEREAS, businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans have traditionally received less than a proportionate share of regulated public utility procurement contracts, especially in renewable energy, wireless telecommunications, broadband, and smart grid projects, and

WHEREAS, it is in the state's interest to expeditiously improve the economic climate for businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans, and

WHEREAS, the position of these businesses can be substantially improved by providing long-range, substantial goals for procurement by regulated public utilities of technology, equipment, supplies, services, materials, and construction work, especially in renewable energy, wireless telecommunications, broadband, and smart grid projects from businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans, and

WHEREAS, this initiative also benefits the regulated public utilities and consumers of this state by encouraging the

expansion of the number of suppliers, thereby encouraging competition and promoting economic efficiency in the process, and

WHEREAS, the long-term economic viability of this state depends substantially upon the ability of renewable energy, wireless telecommunications, broadband, and smart grid projects to involve businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans in the procurement process, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

## Section 1. It is the purpose of this act to:

(1) Encourage greater economic opportunity for businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans.

(2) Promote competition among the suppliers of a regulated public utility in order to enhance economic efficiency in the procurement of contracts with regulated companies and with the subsidiaries of regulated companies which are regulated by the Public Service Commission.

(3) Provide direction to and expand programs for the procurement by regulated public utilities of technology, equipment, supplies, services, materials, and construction work from businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans.

Section 2. <u>Supplier Diversity.-</u>

(1) For the purposes of this section, the term:

(a) "Commission" means the Florida Public Service

(b) "Control" means exercising the power to make policy decisions.

- (c) "Disabled-veteran business enterprise" means an independently owned and operated business that:
  - 1. Employs 200 or fewer permanent full-time employees;
- 2. Together with its affiliates has a net worth of \$5 million or less, or, if a sole proprietorship, has a net worth of \$5 million or less including both personal and business investments;
  - 3. Is organized to engage in commercial transactions;
  - 4. Is domiciled in this state;
- 5. Is at least 51 percent owned by one or more permanent Florida residents who have a service-connected disability as determined by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs or who have been terminated from military service by reason of disability by the United States Department of Defense; and
- 6. Is controlled and operated by one or more service-disabled veterans or, for a service-disabled veteran having a permanent or total disability, by the spouse or permanent caregiver of the veteran.
- (d) "Minority business enterprise" means a business enterprise that is at least 51 percent owned by a minority group or groups. In the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of the stock must be owned by one or more minority groups. The management and daily business operations of the minority business enterprise must be controlled by one or more minority individuals. The term "minority" includes black Americans, Hispanic-Americans, Native Americans, and Asian-

- (e) "Operate" means active involvement in day-to-day management.
- (f) "Regulated company" means a public utility as defined in s. 366.02 or any person holding a valid and current certificate from the commission under chapter 351, chapter 364, chapter 365, or chapter 367 and that has gross annual revenues exceeding \$25 million.
- (g) "Woman business enterprise" means a business enterprise that is at least 51 percent owned by a woman or women. In the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of the stock must be owned by one or more women. The management and daily business operations of the woman business enterprise must be controlled by one or more women.
- (2) (a) The commission shall require each regulated company to submit annually, a detailed and verifiable plan for increasing procurement from woman, minority, and disabledveteran business enterprises in all categories, including, but not limited to, renewable energy and smart grid projects.
- (b) These annual plans must include short- and long-term goals and timetables and methods for encouraging both prime contractors and grantees to engage woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprises in subcontracts in all categories that provide subcontracting opportunities, including, but not limited to, renewable energy and smart grid projects. An annual plan may not include quotas.
- (c) The commission shall establish guidelines for each regulated company and its commission-regulated subsidiaries and affiliates to use in establishing programs pursuant to this

(d) Each regulated company shall furnish an annual report to the commission regarding the implementation of programs established pursuant to this section in a form and at a time annually determined by the commission.

- (e) 1. The commission shall provide a report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on September 1 of each year, on the progress of activities undertaken pursuant to this section by each regulated company and its commission-regulated subsidiaries and affiliates. The report shall include information on procurement contracts made by woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprises as compared to at least a majority of the workforces in the state, to the extent that such information is readily accessible. The commission shall recommend a plan to implement this section, together with legislative recommendations it deems necessary or desirable to further this policy. The commission shall also make the report available on its Internet website.
- 2. With regard to disabled-veteran business enterprises, the commission shall ensure that the programs and legislation recommended pursuant to subparagraph 1. are consistent with those of a veteran business enterprise certified under s. 295.187, Florida Statutes.
- (f)1. The Legislature declares that each electrical, gas, water and wastewater, wireless, and telephone corporation that is not required to submit a plan pursuant to paragraph (a) is encouraged to voluntarily adopt a plan for increasing woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprise procurement in all categories.

2. The Legislature declares that each cable television corporation and direct broadcast satellite provider is encouraged to voluntarily adopt a plan for increasing woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprise procurement and to voluntarily report activity in this area to the Legislature on an annual basis.

- (3) (a) The commission may adopt rules for verifying and determining the eligibility of woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprises for procurement contracts.
- (b) The commission shall develop and require each regulated company and its commission-regulated subsidiaries and affiliates to implement an outreach program to inform and recruit woman, minority, and disabled-veteran business enterprises to apply for procurement contracts under this section.
- (4) A person, including a corporation through its directors, officers, or agents, that falsely represents a business as a woman, minority, or disabled-veteran business enterprise in the procurement of, or the attempt to procure, contracts from a regulated company or a commission-regulated subsidiary or affiliate, commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, Florida Statutes, or s. 775.083, Florida Statutes. In the case of a corporation, the fine or imprisonment, or both, shall be imposed on each director, officer, or agent responsible for the false statement.
- (5) (a) In order to promote the inclusion and participation of businesses controlled and operated by women, minorities, and disabled veterans in contract procurement, a corporation may consider implementing the following measures in each phase of its contracting:

204 <u>1. Timely or progressive payments to woman, minority, or</u> 205 disabled-veteran business enterprises.

- 2. An amendment of the performance bond requirements to ensure that they do not prohibitively burden these businesses from participating.
- 3. The provision of assistance to these businesses by securing contract payments with letters of credit, negotiable securities, or other financing arrangements or measures.
- (b) This section does not restrict a corporation's ability to require a bond.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
