HB 237 2013

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program; amending s. 1002.395, F.S.; requiring a private school participating in the program to report to the Department of Education the assessment scores of any students who are administered certain assessments; requiring the department to publish the scores on its website; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (8) of section 1002.395, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1002.395 Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program.-

- (8) PRIVATE SCHOOL ELIGIBILITY AND OBLIGATIONS.—An eligible private school may be sectarian or nonsectarian and must:
- (c) Be academically accountable to the parent for meeting the educational needs of the student by:
- 1. At a minimum, annually providing to the parent a written explanation of the student's progress.
- 2. Annually administering or making provision for students participating in the scholarship program in grades 3 through 10 to take one of the nationally norm-referenced tests identified by the Department of Education or the statewide assessments pursuant to s. 1008.22. Students with disabilities for whom standardized testing is not appropriate are exempt from this requirement. A participating private school must report a

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student's scores to the parent. A participating private school must annually report by August 15 the scores of all participating students to the independent research organization described in paragraph (9)(j).

- 3. Cooperating with the scholarship student whose parent chooses to have the student participate in the statewide assessments pursuant to s. 1008.22 or, if a private school chooses to offer the statewide assessments, administering the assessments at the school.
- a. A participating private school may choose to offer and administer the statewide assessments to all students who attend the private school in grades 3 through 10. A participating private school shall report to the Department of Education the scores of any students who are administered the statewide assessments or any nationally norm-referenced tests. The department shall publish the scores on its website so that a parent is able to compare the assessment scores of participating private schools to determine the best school for his or her child.
- b. A participating private school must submit a request in writing to the Department of Education by March 1 of each year in order to administer the statewide assessments in the subsequent school year.

The inability of a private school to meet the requirements of this subsection shall constitute a basis for the ineligibility of the private school to participate in the scholarship program as determined by the Department of Education. HB 237 2013

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

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
