Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Subsection (14) of section 489.503, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (23) is added to that section, to read:

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489.503 Exemptions.-This part does not apply to: (14)<del>(a)</del> The sale of, installation of, repair of,

alteration of, addition to, or design of electrical wiring, 12 fixtures, appliances, thermostats, apparatus, raceways, 13 14 computers, customer premises equipment, customer premises 15 wiring, and conduit, or any part thereof, by an employee, 16 contractor, subcontractor, or affiliate of a company operating under a certificate issued under chapter 364 or chapter 610, or 17 18 under a local franchise or right-of-way agreement, if when those 19 items are for the purpose of transmitting data, voice, video, or 20 other communications, or commands as part of a cable television,
