Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 489.503, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

489.503 Exemptions.—This part does not apply to:

- (5) (a) The sale or installation of any finished products, materials, or articles of merchandise which are not actually fabricated into, and do not become a permanent fixed part of, the structure. This subsection shall not be construed to limit the exemptions provided in subsection (6).
- (b) Employees and sales representatives of an alarm system contractor, other than employees that (i) attend end-user premises to install or repair alarm systems or (ii) have access to alarm system arm or disarm codes or alarm system installer codes for specific end-user locations.
 - (c) Employees and sales representatives of an alarm system

contractor who are located outside the state of Florida provided that they are in compliance with the applicable alarm laws of the state in which they are located provided that the applicable state regulation requires a fingerprint and criminal background check or that the individual has otherwise received a satisfactory fingerprint and criminal background check from a state or federal agency and provided that they do not attend end-user premises to install or repair alarm systems.

This subsection shall not be construed to limit the exemptions provided in subsection(6).

Section 2. Section 553.793, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

553.793 Streamlined Low-Voltage Alarm System Installation
Permitting.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Contractor" means a person who is qualified to engage in the business of electrical or alarm system contracting pursuant to a certificate or registration issued by the department under part II of chapter 489.
- (b) "Low-voltage alarm system project" means a project related to the installation, maintenance, inspection, replacement, or service of any new or existing alarm system, as defined in s. 489.505, operating at low voltage, as defined in the National Electrical Code Standard 70, Current Edition, and ancillary components or equipment attached to such a system including but not limited to home-automation equipment, thermostats, and video cameras. When a fire alarm is being installed or replaced and a plan review is required, this

section is not applicable.

- (2) Notwithstanding any provision of law, this section applies to low-voltage alarm system projects for which a permit is required by a local enforcement agency.
- (3) A local enforcement agency shall make uniform basic permit labels available for purchase by a contractor to be used for the installation of a new or replacement of an existing alarm system, at a cost of not more than \$55 per label per project. A contractor may purchase labels in bulk for one or more unspecified current or future projects.
- (a) A local enforcement agency may not require a contractor, as a condition of purchasing a label, to submit information other than identification information of the licensee and proof of registration or certification as a contractor.
- (b) A label is valid for 1 year from the date of purchase and may only be used within the jurisdiction in which it was issued.
- (4) A contractor shall post an unused uniform basic permit label in a conspicuous place on the premises of the low-voltage alarm system project site before commencing work on the project.
- (5) A contractor is not required to notify the local enforcement agency before commencing work on a low-voltage alarm system project. However, a contractor must submit a Uniform Notice of Installation of a Low-Voltage Alarm System Project, a notice form provided under subsection (6), to the local enforcement agency within 21 days after completing the project. A local enforcement agency may take disciplinary action against a contractor who fails to timely submit a Uniform Notice of a Low-Voltage Alarm System Project.
