27	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
28	necessity that images obtained through the use of an automated
29	traffic law enforcement system be exempt from public records
30	requirements. The release of such images held by an agency and
31	personal identifying information in data generated from such
32	images could enable a third party to track a person's movements
33	and compile a history on where a person has driven. This
34	exemption is necessary because the public disclosure of such
35	information constitutes an unwarranted invasion into the
36	personal life and privacy of a person. The harm from disclosing
37	such information outweighs the public benefit that can be
38	derived from widespread and unregulated public access to such
39	information.
40	Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date
41	that HB 553 or similar legislation takes effect, if such
42	legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an

43 extension thereof and becomes a law.
