Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that proprietary confidential business information provided in the written report required to be filed with the Florida State Boxing Commission by a promoter after a match, or obtained by the commission through an audit of the promoter's books and records, pursuant to s. 548.06, Florida Statutes, be made confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Proprietary confidential business information is information that a promoter does not intend to be released or disclosed. It includes the number of ticket sales for a match; the amount of

gross receipts after a match; trade secrets; business plans; internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors; security measures, systems, or procedures; and information relating to competitive interests of the promoter. The disclosure of such information would adversely affect the business interests of the promoter providing the information by harming the promoter in the marketplace and by impairing the competitive business interests of the promoter providing the information. Disclosure of such information would reveal the business interests of the promoter, including its financial status and business plan, thereby putting the promoter at a competitive disadvantage. Competitors can use such information to impair fair competition and impede competition. Thus, the public and private harm in disclosing proprietary confidential business information of a promoter significantly outweighs any public benefit derived from disclosure.
