- (b) Each school health advisory committee must, at a minimum, include members who represent the eight component areas of the Coordinated School Health model as defined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. School health advisory committees are encouraged to address the eight components of the Coordinated School Health model in the school district's school wellness policy pursuant to s. 1003.453.
- (c) Each county health department shall, subject to availability of funds, develop a school-located influenza vaccination program. The purpose of the program is to offer all

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public and nonpublic school children an influenza vaccination at
no cost to their families.

- 1. A county health department may contract with local health care practitioners or a private entity to administer the program.
- 2. Each school shall appoint a part-time school staff
  person as an influenza immunization coordinator to facilitate
  the program. The county health department shall compensate such
  person.
- 3. All school-located influenza vaccination programs shall use the same parental consent form approved by the Department Of Health. Each participating school shall submit an annual report to the county health department that indicates the number of students enrolled in the program, the number of forms returned, the number of forms on which the parent gives consent for the student to be immunized, and the number of students immunized. All influenza immunizations of children shall be reported to Florida SHOTS, the statewide immunization registry.
- 4. The University of Florida Emerging Pathogens Institute shall provide training and support for the influenza immunization coordinators and conduct a formative evaluation to monitor immunization rates and a summative evaluation to determine the impact of the program on influenza illness in children and adults in the community. The institute shall provide a summary of the evaluation data to each county health department, the department, and the public.
