A bill to be entitled

An act relating to animal cruelty; amending s. 828.073, F.S.; adding state attorneys to the list of entities authorized to file a petition in county court requiring the court to hold a hearing to determine whether an animal owner is able to care for the animal; amending s. 828.12, F.S.; requiring a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment for an act of aggravated animal cruelty; changing the minimum mandatory period of incarceration for a second or subsequent violation of animal cruelty from 6 months to 5 years; encouraging persons to report suspected animal cruelty; making it unlawful for an employer to prohibit an employee or volunteer from reporting suspected animal cruelty; amending s. 828.13, F.S.; providing that it is a crime to keep an animal in an enclosure without wholesome exercise or exchange of air; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; revising the ranking of certain animal cruelty offenses in the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (2) and (3) and paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 828.073, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

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828.073 Animals found in distress; when agent may take charge; hearing; disposition; sale.—

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(2) Any law enforcement officer or any agent of any county or of any society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals appointed under the provisions of s. 828.03 may:

- (a) Lawfully take custody of any animal found neglected or cruelly treated by removing the animal from its present location, or
- (b) Order the owner of any animal found neglected or cruelly treated to provide certain care to the animal at the owner's expense without removal of the animal from its present location,

and shall file a petition seeking relief under this section in the county court of the county in which the animal is found within 10 days after the animal is seized or an order to provide care is issued. A state attorney may also file a petition seeking relief under this section in the county court of the county in which the animal is found within 10 days after the animal is seized or an order to provide care is issued. The court shall schedule and commence a hearing on the petition within 30 days after the petition is filed to determine whether the owner, if known, is able to provide adequately for the animal and is fit to have custody of the animal. The hearing shall be concluded and the court order entered thereon within 60 days after the date the hearing is commenced. The timeframes set forth in this subsection are not jurisdictional. However, if a failure to meet such timeframes is attributable to the officer, state attorney, or agent, the owner is not required to pay the officer or agent for care of the animal during any period of delay caused by the officer or agent. A fee may not be charged

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for filing the petition. This subsection does not require court action for the taking into custody and making proper disposition of stray or abandoned animals as lawfully performed by animal control agents.

- (3) The officer, state attorney, or agent of any county or of any society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals filing a petition taking charge of any animal pursuant to the provisions of this section shall have written notice served, at least 3 days before the hearing scheduled under subsection (2), upon the owner of the animal, if he or she is known and is residing in the county where the animal was taken, in conformance with the provisions of chapter 48 relating to service of process. The sheriff of the county shall not charge a fee for service of such notice.
- (5) In determining the person's fitness to have custody of an animal under the provisions of this section act, the court may consider, among other matters:
- (a) Testimony from the agent or officer who seized the animal, a state attorney, and other witnesses as to the condition of the animal when seized and as to the conditions under which the animal was kept.

Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 828.12, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (6) is added to that section, to read:

828.12 Cruelty to animals.-

(1) A person who unnecessarily overloads, overdrives, torments, deprives of necessary sustenance or shelter, or unnecessarily mutilates, or kills any animal, or causes the same to be done, or carries in or upon any vehicle, or otherwise, any

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animal in a cruel or inhumane manner, commits animal cruelty, a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083 or by a fine of not more than \$5,000, or both.

- (2) A person who intentionally commits an act to any animal, or a person who owns or has the custody or control of any animal and fails to act, which results in the cruel death, or excessive or repeated infliction of unnecessary pain or suffering, or causes the same to be done, commits aggravated animal cruelty, a felony of the third degree, and shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 30 months and ordered to pay punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or by a fine of not more than \$5,000 \$10,000, or both.
- (a) A person convicted of a violation of this subsection, where the finder of fact determines that the violation includes the knowing and intentional torture or torment of an animal that injures, mutilates, or kills the animal, shall be ordered to pay a minimum mandatory fine of \$2,500 and undergo psychological counseling or complete an anger management treatment program.
- (b) A person convicted of a second or subsequent violation of this subsection shall be required to pay a minimum mandatory fine of \$5,000 and serve a minimum mandatory period of incarceration of 5 years 6 months. In addition, the person shall be released only upon expiration of sentence, is not eligible for parole, control release, or any form of early release, and must serve 100 percent of the court-imposed sentence. Any plea of nolo contendere shall be considered a conviction for purposes of this subsection.
 - (6) The Legislature encourages persons to report suspected
