CS/CS/HB 647 2014

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to infectious disease control; directing the Department of Health to convene a study group to evaluate and make recommendations regarding certain activities related to antibiotic-resistant bacteria; providing for qualifications and appointment of study group members; authorizing reimbursement for travel expenses; providing duties and responsibilities of the study group; requiring submission of a report and recommendations to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) The Department of Health, as the state's lead agency for infection control policy, shall convene a study group to evaluate and make recommendations regarding the efficacy of state surveillance, mandatory reporting, public notification, prevention, and response activities related to antibiotic-resistant bacteria.

(2) (a) The study group must include, at a minimum, representatives of licensed facilities, including representation from licensees under chapter 395, chapter 400, chapter 429, and part I of chapter 483, Florida Statutes; licensed health care practitioners, including representation from licensees under

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chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 464, and chapter 474, Florida

Statutes; the Agency for Health Care Administration; the

Department of Elderly Affairs; and the Department of Health. At

least one member of the study group must be a certified

infection control practitioner.

- (b) Members of the study group may be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (3) The study group shall evaluate the list of currently reportable antibiotic-resistant bacteria; reporting procedures, including the content and format of the reports; notification procedures, including the modes and the network of distribution; and response procedures, including coordination with other departments and agencies of state government, county and municipal governments, school boards, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, facilities that may be affected by an outbreak, and the public. The study group shall examine ways to expand public access to information that relates to the presence of antibiotic-resistant bacterial infections.
- (4) The study group shall submit a report of its findings and a recommended action plan for implementation, together with any recommended legislation, to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than January 1, 2015.
- Section 2. For the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the sum of \$50,000 in nonrecurring funds from the Administrative Trust Fund is appropriated to the Department of Health for the purpose of
