An act relating to the Bay Medical Center, Bay County; amending chapter 2005-343, Laws of Florida; providing that the pension plan is an irrevocable trust; providing for control of the plan; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Sections 9 and 10 of section 3 of chapter 2005-343, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as sections 10 and 11, respectively, and a new section 9 is added to section 3 of that chapter, to read:

Section 9. The Bay Medical Center pension plan, as adopted effective January 1, 2004, and restated January 1, 2013, is declared to be an irrevocable trust in accordance with s.

112.66(8), Florida Statutes. The assets and liabilities of the plan shall be under the control of the board of trustees of the plan and are not the responsibility of a governmental unit.

Section 10. 9. The effectuation of the authorized purposes under the provisions of this act shall be in all respects for the benefit of the people of Bay County and is hereby declared to be for the preservation of the public health, for the public good, and for the use of the public of the county; and, since the board will be performing essential governmental functions in effectuating such purposes, the board or any other agency,

 instrumentality, or body in charge of the hospital shall not be required to pay any taxes or assessments of any kind or nature whatsoever upon any property required or used for or in connection with any additions, extensions, and improvements to such hospital or hospitals or system or systems, or any rates, fees, rentals, receipts, or income at any time received from the operation thereof; and all bonds issued hereunder, their transfer, and the income therefrom, including any profits made on the sale thereof, shall at all times be free from taxation of any kind by the state or by any political subdivision, taxing agency, or instrumentality thereof.

Section 11. 10. The Legislature intends that the provisions of this act shall be liberally construed in order to accomplish the remedial purposes of this act which are to give the board a reasonable opportunity to manage and develop a public hospital or hospitals and other facilities in an increasingly competitive and rapidly changing marketplace in order to provide quality and comprehensive health care for the residents of Bay County, regardless of ability to pay. Where strict construction of this act would result in the defeat of the accomplishment of any of the purposes of this act, and a liberal construction would permit or assist in the accomplishment thereof, the liberal construction shall be chosen. In the event any provision of this act is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable, the remainder of this act shall continue in full force and effect and be

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
