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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the local government infrastructure surtax; amending s. 212.055, F.S.; authorizing the use of the surtax for the restoration or maintenance of natural water bodies for public use; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (i) is added to subsection (2) of section 212.055, Florida Statutes, to read:

212.055 Discretionary sales surtaxes; legislative intent; authorization and use of proceeds.—It is the legislative intent that any authorization for imposition of a discretionary sales surtax shall be published in the Florida Statutes as a subsection of this section, irrespective of the duration of the levy. Each enactment shall specify the types of counties authorized to levy; the rate or rates which may be imposed; the maximum length of time the surtax may be imposed, if any; the procedure which must be followed to secure voter approval, if required; the purpose for which the proceeds may be expended; and such other requirements as the Legislature may provide. Taxable transactions and administrative procedures shall be as provided in s. 212.054.

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referendum approves the county's exclusive use of the surtax for a project involving the capital restoration or maintenance of natural water bodies for public use, including tributaries, canals, stormwater conveyance systems, and channels connected to such natural water bodies, the proceeds from the surtax, or the bonds pledging the surtax for such use, may be used for such purpose. Expenditures may include the cost of planning, engineering, equipment, improvements required to reduce pollutant source input, restoration of natural filtration systems, dredging operations related to economically or ecologically beneficial muck removal, or any other activities deemed necessary to implement the county's restoration or maintenance plan.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
