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A bill to be entitled An act relating to the statewide prepaid dental program for Medicaid-eligible children; creating s. 409.91205, F.S.; providing legislative findings and intent; establishing the statewide prepaid dental program for Medicaid-eligible children; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to contract with prepaid dental health plans meeting specified criteria; requiring the agency to apply for and implement state plan amendments or waivers of applicable federal laws and regulations necessary to implement the program; requiring the agency to issue a competitive procurement to licensed prepaid dental health plans to implement the program; requiring the agency to include all counties in the procurement; providing that enrollment in the program shall begin by a specified date, but not until necessary state plan amendments or waivers of applicable federal laws and regulations are implemented; providing that a Medicaid-eligible child shall receive dental services through the Medicaid managed medical assistance program during a specified period; requiring the agency to provide any required notice to Medicaid recipients regarding the transition to the program; providing that the agency may assess the costs incurred in providing the notice to prepaid dental health plans participating in the program; requiring participating plans to submit encounter data and to comply with a specified medical loss ratio; requiring

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the agency to submit an annual report to the Governor and Legislature; specifying the contents of the report; amending s. 409.973, F.S.; deleting the requirement that managed care plans participating in the Medicaid managed medical assistance program provide children's dental services; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 409.91205, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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409.91205 Statewide prepaid dental program for Medicaideligible children.—

(1) The Legislature finds that an overriding concern in the

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48 49 design and delivery of Medicaid dental services is ensuring the dental health of children. to dental services is provided.

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(2) Notwithstanding part IV, the agency shall establish the statewide prepaid dental program for Medicaid-eligible children by contracting on a prepaid or fixed-sum basis with at least two appropriately licensed prepaid dental health plans to provide dental services. Such plans must demonstrate extensive experience in administering dental benefits for children enrolled in Medicaid and in developing and maintaining statewide dental and specialty dental provider networks for Medicaid programs.

- (a) The agency shall apply for and implement state plan amendments or waivers of applicable federal laws and regulations necessary to implement the program.
- (b) The agency shall issue a competitive procurement to licensed prepaid dental health plans to implement the program.

 The agency shall include all counties in the competitive procurement.
- (c) Enrollment in the program may not begin until the necessary state plan amendments or waivers of applicable federal laws and regulations are implemented; however, the Legislature intends that enrollment begin no later than September 1, 2016.
- (d) Between the date this act takes effect and the implementation of the program, each Medicaid-eligible child shall receive dental services as provided in part IV until he or she is eligible to enroll in the program.
- (e) Before enrollment begins for the program, the agency shall provide any required notice to Medicaid recipients regarding the transition. The agency may assess the costs incurred in providing such notice to the participating plans.
 - (f) The agency's contract with each participating plan

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shall require the plan to submit encounter data as described in s. 409.967(2)(d) and to comply with a medical loss ratio of 85 percent. The medical loss ratio calculation must use uniform financial data collected from all plans, must be computed for each plan on a statewide basis, and must require that expenditures be classified in a manner consistent with 45 C.F.R. part 158.

(3) The agency shall submit a report by January 15 of each year to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on the operation of the statewide prepaid dental program. The report must compare the combined annual benefits utilization and encounter data reported by all participating plans with the agency's projected and budgeted annual program costs; must evaluate the extent to which each participating plan is complying with the contract terms and conditions; must address the effect that each participating plan's operation is having on access to dental services for Medicaid-eligible children in the plan's service area; and must address the statistical trends associated with indicators of good oral health for the children served, as compared to the general population of the state.

Section 2. Paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 409.973, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

409.973 Benefits.-

- (1) MINIMUM BENEFITS.—Managed care plans shall cover, at a minimum, the following services:
 - (e) Adult dental services as described in s. 409.906(1). Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
