An act relating to the regulation of health care
facilities and services; amending s. 400.474, F.S.;
revising the information that a home health agency is
required to submit to the Agency for Health Care
Administration for license renewal; removing the
requirement that a home health agency submit quarterly
reports; amending s. 408.036, F.S.; providing an
exemption from a certificate-of-need review for
applicants that were previously licensed within a
specified period as a health care facility or provider
and that meet certain criteria; providing an exception
for an applicant whose license expired during a
specified time period to apply for an exemption from
the review; providing an effective date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
Section 1. Subsection (7) of section 400.474, Florida
Statutes, is amended to read:
400.474 Administrative penalties
(7) A home health agency shall submit to the agency, with
each license renewal application, the number of patients who
receive home health services from the home health agency on the
day that the license renewal application is filed, within 15
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27 days after the end of each calendar quarter, a written report 28 that includes the following data as they existed on the last day 29 of the quarter: 30 (a) The number of insulin-dependent diabetic patients who 31 receive insulin-injection services from the home health agency. 32 (b) The number of patients who receive both home health 33 services from the home health agency and hospice services. 34 (c) The number of patients who receive home health 35 services from the home health agency. (d) The name and license number of each nurse whose 36 37 primary job responsibility is to provide home health services to 38 patients and who received remuneration from the home health 39 agency in excess of \$25,000 during the calendar quarter. 40 41 If the home health agency fails to submit the written 42 quarterly report within 15 days after the end of each calendar 43 quarter, the Agency for Health Care Administration shall impose 44 a fine against the home health agency in the amount of \$200 per 45 day until the Agency for Health Care Administration receives the report, except that the total fine imposed pursuant to this 46 47 subsection may not exceed \$5,000 per quarter. A home health agency is exempt from submission of the report and the 48 49 imposition of the fine if it is not a Medicaid or Medicare provider or if it does not share a controlling interest with a 50 51 licensee, as defined in s. 408.803, which bills the Florida 52 Medicaid program or the Medicare program.
