An act relating to cannabis; amending s. 893.03, F.S.; removing cannabis from the schedule of controlled substances; amending ss. 456.0635, 772.12, 856.015, 893.02, 893.055, 893.0551, 893.13, 893.135, 893.1351, 893.145, 893.147, 893.15, 921.0022, 944.47, 948.20, 951.22, 985.711, and 1003.57, F.S.; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 893.03, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

893.03 Standards and schedules.—The substances enumerated in this section are controlled by this chapter. The controlled substances listed or to be listed in Schedules I, II, III, IV, and V are included by whatever official, common, usual, chemical, or trade name designated. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to include within any of the schedules contained in this section any excluded drugs listed within the purview of 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.22, styled "Excluded Substances"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.24, styled "Exempt Chemical Preparations"; 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.32, styled "Exempted Prescription Products"; or 21 C.F.R. s. 1308.34, styled "Exempt Anabolic Steroid Products."

(1) SCHEDULE I.—A substance in Schedule I has a high potential for abuse and has no currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United States and in its use under medical

Section 2. Subsection (2) and paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 456.0635, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

456.0635 Health care fraud; disqualification for license, certificate, or registration.—

- (2) Each board within the jurisdiction of the department, or the department if there is no board, shall refuse to admit a candidate to any examination and refuse to issue a license, certificate, or registration to any applicant if the candidate or applicant or any principal, officer, agent, managing employee, or affiliated person of the applicant:
- (a) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under chapter 409, chapter 817, or chapter 893, or a similar felony offense committed in another state or jurisdiction, unless the candidate or applicant has successfully completed a drug court program for that felony and provides proof that the plea has been withdrawn or the charges have been dismissed. Any such conviction or plea shall exclude the applicant or candidate from licensure, examination, certification, or registration unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended:
- 1. For felonies of the first or second degree, more than 15 years before the date of application.
- 2. For felonies of the third degree, more than 10 years before the date of application, except for felonies of the third

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degree under s. 893.13(5)(a) s. 893.13(6)(a).

- 3. For felonies of the third degree under $\underline{s. 893.13(5)(a)}$ $\underline{s. 893.13(6)(a)}$, more than 5 years before the date of application;
- (b) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under 21 U.S.C. ss. 801-970, or 42 U.S.C. ss. 1395-1396, unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended more than 15 years before the date of the application;
- (c) Has been terminated for cause from the Florida Medicaid program pursuant to s. 409.913, unless the candidate or applicant has been in good standing with the Florida Medicaid program for the most recent 5 years;
- (d) Has been terminated for cause, pursuant to the appeals procedures established by the state, from any other state Medicaid program, unless the candidate or applicant has been in good standing with a state Medicaid program for the most recent 5 years and the termination occurred at least 20 years before the date of the application; or
- (e) Is currently listed on the United States Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General's List of Excluded Individuals and Entities.

This subsection does not apply to candidates or applicants for initial licensure or certification who were enrolled in an educational or training program on or before July 1, 2009, which was recognized by a board or, if there is no board, recognized by the department, and who applied for licensure after July 1,

(3) The department shall refuse to renew a license, certificate, or registration of any applicant if the applicant or any principal, officer, agent, managing employee, or affiliated person of the applicant:

- (a) Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a felony under chapter 409, chapter 817, or chapter 893, or a similar felony offense committed in another state or jurisdiction, unless the applicant is currently enrolled in a drug court program that allows the withdrawal of the plea for that felony upon successful completion of that program. Any such conviction or plea excludes the applicant from licensure renewal unless the sentence and any subsequent period of probation for such conviction or plea ended:
- 1. For felonies of the first or second degree, more than 15 years before the date of application.
- 2. For felonies of the third degree, more than 10 years before the date of application, except for felonies of the third degree under s. 893.13(5)(a) = 893.13(6)(a).
- 3. For felonies of the third degree under $\underline{s.893.13(5)(a)}$ $\underline{s.893.13(6)(a)}$, more than 5 years before the date of application.

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 772.12, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

772.12 Drug Dealer Liability Act.-

(2) A person, including any governmental entity, has a cause of action for threefold the actual damages sustained and is entitled to minimum damages in the amount of \$1,000 and

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reasonable <u>attorney</u> attorney's fees and court costs in the trial and appellate courts, if the person proves by the greater weight of the evidence that:

- (a) The person was injured because of the defendant's actions that resulted in the defendant's conviction for:
- 1. A violation of s. 893.13, except for a violation of s. 893.13(2)(a) or (b), $\frac{(4)}{(5)}$, $\frac{(5)}{(a)}$, $\frac{(6)}{(a)}$, $\frac{(b)}{(b)}$, or (c), or (6) $\frac{(7)}{(7)}$; or
 - 2. A violation of s. 893.135; and
- (b) The person was not injured by reason of his or her participation in the same act or transaction that resulted in the defendant's conviction for any offense described in subparagraph (a)1.

Section 4. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 856.015, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

856.015 Open house parties.-

- (1) Definitions.—As used in this section:
- (c) "Drug" means a controlled substance, as that term is defined in ss. 893.02(3) ss. 893.02(4) and 893.03.

Section 5. Present subsection (3) of section 893.02, Florida Statutes, is amended, and present subsections (4) through (23) of that section are redesignated as subsections (3) through (22), respectively, to read:

- 893.02 Definitions.—The following words and phrases as used in this chapter shall have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:
- (3) "Cannabis" means all parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound,

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manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin. The term does not include "low-THC cannabis," as defined in s. 381.986, if manufactured, possessed, sold, purchased, delivered, distributed, or dispensed, in conformance with s. 381.986.

Section 6. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1), paragraph (b) of subsection (2), and paragraph (f) of subsection (7) of section 893.055, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

893.055 Prescription drug monitoring program.-

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Patient advisory report" or "advisory report" means information provided by the department in writing, or as determined by the department, to a prescriber, dispenser, pharmacy, or patient concerning the dispensing of controlled substances. All advisory reports are for informational purposes only and impose no obligations of any nature or any legal duty on a prescriber, dispenser, pharmacy, or patient. The patient advisory report shall be provided in accordance with s. 893.13(6)(a)8. s. 893.13(7)(a)8. The advisory reports issued by the department are not subject to discovery or introduction into evidence in any civil or administrative action against a prescriber, dispenser, pharmacy, or patient arising out of matters that are the subject of the report; and a person who participates in preparing, reviewing, issuing, or any other activity related to an advisory report may not be permitted or required to testify in any such civil action as to any findings, recommendations, evaluations, opinions, or other actions taken in connection with preparing, reviewing, or issuing such a report.

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(b) The department, when the direct support organization receives at least \$20,000 in nonstate moneys or the state receives at least \$20,000 in federal grants for the prescription drug monitoring program, shall adopt rules as necessary concerning the reporting, accessing the database, evaluation, management, development, implementation, operation, security, and storage of information within the system, including rules for when patient advisory reports are provided to pharmacies and prescribers. The patient advisory report shall be provided in accordance with s. 893.13(6)(a)8. $\frac{893.13(7)(a)8}{a}$ The department shall work with the professional health care licensure boards, such as the Board of Medicine, the Board of Osteopathic Medicine, and the Board of Pharmacy; other appropriate organizations, such as the Florida Pharmacy Association, the Florida Medical Association, the Florida Retail Federation, and the Florida Osteopathic Medical Association, including those relating to pain management; and the Attorney General, the Department of Law Enforcement, and the Agency for Health Care Administration to develop rules appropriate for the prescription drug monitoring program.

(7)

- (f) The program manager, upon determining a pattern consistent with the rules established under paragraph (2)(d) and having cause to believe a violation of s. 893.13(6)(a)8., (7) (a), or (7) (b) s. 893.13(7) (a) 8., (8) (a), or (8) (b) has occurred, may provide relevant information to the applicable law enforcement agency.
 - Section 7. Subsection (4) of section 893.0551, Florida

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Statutes, is amended to read:

 $893.0551\ \mathrm{Public}$ records exemption for the prescription drug monitoring program.—

(4) If the department determines consistent with its rules that a pattern of controlled substance abuse exists, the department may disclose such confidential and exempt information to the applicable law enforcement agency in accordance with s. 893.055. The law enforcement agency may disclose to a criminal justice agency, as defined in s. 119.011, only confidential and exempt information received from the department that is relevant to an identified active investigation that is specific to a violation of \underline{s} . 893.13(6)(a)8. \underline{s} . 893.13(7)(a)8., \underline{s} . 893.13(8)(b).

Section 8. Present subsection (3) of section 893.13, Florida Statutes, is amended, present subsections (4) through (10) are redesignated as subsections (3) through (9), respectively, and present subsection (6) and present paragraph (a) of subsection (8) of that section are amended, to read:

893.13 Prohibited acts; penalties.-

(3) A person who delivers, without consideration, 20 grams or less of cannabis, as defined in this chapter, commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. As used in this paragraph, the term "cannabis" does not include the resin extracted from the plants of the genus Cannabis or any compound manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such resin.

(5) (6) (a) A person may not be in actual or constructive possession of a controlled substance unless such controlled

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substance was lawfully obtained from a practitioner or pursuant to a valid prescription or order of a practitioner while acting in the course of his or her professional practice or to be in actual or constructive possession of a controlled substance except as otherwise authorized by this chapter. A person who violates this provision commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(b) If the offense is the possession of 20 grams or less of cannabis, as defined in this chapter, or 3 grams or less of a controlled substance described in s. 893.03(1)(c)46.-50., 114.-142., 151.-159., or 166.-173., the person commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. As used in this subsection, the term "cannabis" does not include the resin extracted from the plants of the genus Cannabis, or any compound manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such resin, and a controlled substance described in s. 893.03(1)(c)46.-50., 114.-142., 151.-159., or 166.-173. does not include the substance in a powdered form.

(b) (c) Except as provided in this chapter, a person may not possess more than 10 grams of any substance named or described in s. 893.03(1)(a) or (1)(b), or any combination thereof, or any mixture containing any such substance. A person who violates this paragraph commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(d) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary of the laws of this state relating to arrest, a law enforcement officer may arrest without warrant any person who the officer has probable cause to believe is violating the provisions of this

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chapter relating to possession of cannabis.

(7) (a) Notwithstanding subsection (8) (9), a prescribing practitioner may not:

- 1. Knowingly assist a patient, other person, or the owner of an animal in obtaining a controlled substance through deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent representations in or related to the practice of the prescribing practitioner's professional practice;
- 2. Employ a trick or scheme in the practice of the prescribing practitioner's professional practice to assist a patient, other person, or the owner of an animal in obtaining a controlled substance;
- 3. Knowingly write a prescription for a controlled substance for a fictitious person; or
- 4. Write a prescription for a controlled substance for a patient, other person, or an animal if the sole purpose of writing such prescription is to provide a monetary benefit to, or obtain a monetary benefit for, the prescribing practitioner.
- (8) (9) The provisions of subsections (1) -(7) (1) -(8) are not applicable to the delivery to, or actual or constructive possession for medical or scientific use or purpose only of controlled substances by, persons included in any of the following classes, or the agents or employees of such persons, for use in the usual course of their business or profession or in the performance of their official duties:
 - (a) Pharmacists.
 - (b) Practitioners.
- (c) Persons who procure controlled substances in good faith and in the course of professional practice only, by or under the

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supervision of pharmacists or practitioners employed by them, or for the purpose of lawful research, teaching, or testing, and not for resale.

- (d) Hospitals that procure controlled substances for lawful administration by practitioners, but only for use by or in the particular hospital.
- (e) Officers or employees of state, federal, or local governments acting in their official capacity only, or informers acting under their jurisdiction.
 - (f) Common carriers.
 - (g) Manufacturers, wholesalers, and distributors.
- (h) Law enforcement officers for bona fide law enforcement purposes in the course of an active criminal investigation.
- Section 9. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 893.135, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraphs (b) through (1) of subsection (1) of that section are redesignated as paragraphs (a) through (k), respectively, to read:
- 893.135 Trafficking; mandatory sentences; suspension or reduction of sentences; conspiracy to engage in trafficking.—
- (1) Except as authorized in this chapter or in chapter 499 and notwithstanding the provisions of s. 893.13:
- (a) Any person who knowingly sells, purchases, manufactures, delivers, or brings into this state, or who is knowingly in actual or constructive possession of, in excess of 25 pounds of cannabis, or 300 or more cannabis plants, commits a felony of the first degree, which felony shall be known as "trafficking in cannabis," punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. If the quantity of cannabis involved:
 - 1. Is in excess of 25 pounds, but less than 2,000 pounds,

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or is 300 or more cannabis plants, but not more than 2,000 cannabis plants, such person shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 3 years, and the defendant shall be ordered to pay a fine of \$25,000.

2. Is 2,000 pounds or more, but less than 10,000 pounds, or is 2,000 or more cannabis plants, but not more than 10,000 cannabis plants, such person shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 7 years, and the defendant shall be ordered to pay a fine of \$50,000.

3. Is 10,000 pounds or more, or is 10,000 or more cannabis plants, such person shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 15 calendar years and pay a fine of \$200,000.

For the purpose of this paragraph, a plant, including, but not limited to, a seedling or cutting, is a "cannabis plant" if it has some readily observable evidence of root formation, such as root hairs. To determine if a piece or part of a cannabis plant severed from the cannabis plant is itself a cannabis plant, the severed piece or part must have some readily observable evidence of root formation, such as root hairs. Callous tissue is not readily observable evidence of root formation. The viability and sex of a plant and the fact that the plant may or may not be a dead harvested plant are not relevant in determining if the plant is a "cannabis plant" or in the charging of an offense under this paragraph. Upon conviction, the court shall impose the longest term of imprisonment provided for in this paragraph.

Section 10. Subsection (4) of section 893.1351, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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893.1351 Ownership, lease, rental, or possession for trafficking in or manufacturing a controlled substance.

(4) For the purposes of this section, proof of the possession of 25 or more cannabis plants constitutes prima facie evidence that the cannabis is intended for sale or distribution.

Section 11. Subsections (7) and (12) of section 893.145, Florida Statutes, are amended, and present subsections (8) through (11) of that section are redesignated as subsections (7) through (10), respectively, to read:

893.145 "Drug paraphernalia" defined.—The term "drug paraphernalia" means all equipment, products, and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, transporting, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance in violation of this chapter or s. 877.111. Drug paraphernalia is deemed to be contraband which shall be subject to civil forfeiture. The term includes, but is not limited to:

(7) Separation gins and sifters used, intended for use, or designed for use in removing twigs and seeds from, or in otherwise cleaning or refining, cannabis.

(11) (12) Objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing cannabis, cocaine, hashish, hashish oil, or nitrous oxide into the human body, such as:

(a) Metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or

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ceramic pipes, with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured metal bowls.

- (b) Water pipes.
- (c) Carburetion tubes and devices.
- (d) Smoking and carburetion masks.
- (e) Roach clips: meaning objects used to hold burning material, such as a cannabis cigarette, that has become too small or too short to be held in the hand.
 - (f) Miniature cocaine spoons, and cocaine vials.
 - (g) Chamber pipes.
 - (h) Carburetor pipes.
 - (i) Electric pipes.
 - (j) Air-driven pipes.
 - (k) Chillums.
- (1) Bongs.

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- (m) Ice pipes or chillers.
- (n) A cartridge or canister, which means a small metal device used to contain nitrous oxide.
- (o) A charger, sometimes referred to as a "cracker," which means a small metal or plastic device that contains an interior pin that may be used to expel nitrous oxide from a cartridge or container.
- (p) A charging bottle, which means a device that may be used to expel nitrous oxide from a cartridge or canister.
- (q) A whip-it, which means a device that may be used to expel nitrous oxide.
 - (r) A tank.
 - (s) A balloon.
- (t) A hose or tube.

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- (u) A 2-liter-type soda bottle.
- (v) Duct tape.

Section 12. Paragraph (a) of subsection (6) of section 893.147, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

893.147 Use, possession, manufacture, delivery, transportation, advertisement, or retail sale of drug paraphernalia.—

- (6) RETAIL SALE OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA.-
- (a) It is unlawful for a person to knowingly and willfully sell or offer for sale at retail any drug paraphernalia described in $\underline{s. 893.145(11)(a)-(c)}$ or $\underline{(g)-(m)}$ $\underline{s. 893.145(12)(a)-(c)}$ or $\underline{(g)-(m)}$, other than a pipe that is primarily made of briar, meerschaum, clay, or corn cob.

Section 13. Section 893.15, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

893.15 Rehabilitation.—Any person who violates <u>s.</u>
893.13(5)(a) or (b) <u>s. 893.13(6)(a)</u> or (b) relating to
possession may, in the discretion of the trial judge, be
required to participate in a substance abuse services program
approved or regulated by the Department of Children and Families
pursuant to the provisions of chapter 397, provided the director
of such program approves the placement of the defendant in such
program. Such required participation shall be imposed in
addition to any penalty or probation otherwise prescribed by
law. However, the total time of such penalty, probation, and
program participation shall not exceed the maximum length of
sentence possible for the offense.

- 4. Any controlled substance as defined in $\underline{s.893.02(3)}$ $\underline{s.893.02(4)}$ or any prescription or nonprescription drug having a hypnotic, stimulating, or depressing effect.
- 5. Any firearm or weapon of any kind or any explosive substance.
- 6. Any cellular telephone or other portable communication device intentionally and unlawfully introduced inside the secure perimeter of any state correctional institution without prior authorization or consent from the officer in charge of such correctional institution. As used in this subparagraph, the term "portable communication device" means any device carried, worn, or stored which is designed or intended to receive or transmit verbal or written messages, access or store data, or connect electronically to the Internet or any other electronic device and which allows communications in any form. Such devices include, but are not limited to, portable two-way pagers, handheld radios, cellular telephones, Blackberry-type devices,

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personal digital assistants or PDA's, laptop computers, or any components of these devices which are intended to be used to assemble such devices. The term also includes any new technology that is developed for similar purposes. Excluded from this definition is any device having communication capabilities which has been approved or issued by the department for investigative or institutional security purposes or for conducting other state business.

Section 16. Subsection (1) of section 948.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

948.20 Drug offender probation.-

(1) If it appears to the court upon a hearing that the defendant is a chronic substance abuser whose criminal conduct is a violation of s. 893.13(2)(a) or (5)(a) (6)(a), or other nonviolent felony if such nonviolent felony is committed on or after July 1, 2009, and notwithstanding s. 921.0024 the defendant's Criminal Punishment Code scoresheet total sentence points are 60 points or fewer, the court may either adjudge the defendant guilty or stay and withhold the adjudication of guilt. In either case, the court may also stay and withhold the imposition of sentence and place the defendant on drug offender probation or into a postadjudicatory treatment-based drug court program if the defendant otherwise qualifies. As used in this section, the term "nonviolent felony" means a third degree felony violation under chapter 810 or any other felony offense that is not a forcible felony as defined in s. 776.08.

Section 17. Subsection (1) of section 951.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

951.22 County detention facilities; contraband articles.-

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(1) It is unlawful, except through regular channels as duly authorized by the sheriff or officer in charge, to introduce into or possess upon the grounds of any county detention facility as defined in s. 951.23 or to give to or receive from any inmate of any such facility wherever said inmate is located at the time or to take or to attempt to take or send therefrom any of the following articles which are hereby declared to be contraband for the purposes of this act, to wit: Any written or recorded communication; any currency or coin; any article of food or clothing; any tobacco products as defined in s. 210.25(11); any cigarette as defined in s. 210.01(1); any cigar; any intoxicating beverage or beverage which causes or may cause an intoxicating effect; any narcotic, hypnotic, or excitative drug or drug of any kind or nature, including nasal inhalators, sleeping pills, barbiturates, and controlled substances as defined in s. 893.02(3) s. 893.02(4); any firearm or any instrumentality customarily used or which is intended to be used as a dangerous weapon; and any instrumentality of any nature that may be or is intended to be used as an aid in effecting or attempting to effect an escape from a county facility.

Section 18. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 985.711, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

985.711 Introduction, removal, or possession of certain articles unlawful; penalty.—

(1) (a) Except as authorized through program policy or operating procedure or as authorized by the facility superintendent, program director, or manager, a person may not introduce into or upon the grounds of a juvenile detention facility or commitment program, or take or send, or attempt to

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take or send, from a juvenile detention facility or commitment program, any of the following articles, which are declared to be contraband under this section:

- 1. Any unauthorized article of food or clothing.
- 2. Any intoxicating beverage or any beverage that causes or may cause an intoxicating effect.
 - 3. Any controlled substance, as defined in $\underline{s.893.02(3)}$ $\underline{s.893.02(4)}$, or any prescription or nonprescription drug that has a hypnotic, stimulating, or depressing effect.
 - 4. Any firearm or weapon of any kind or any explosive substance.

Section 19. Paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 1003.57, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.57 Exceptional students instruction.-

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- (i) For purposes of paragraph (h), the term:
- 1. "Controlled substance" means a drug or other substance identified under Schedule I, Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V of the Controlled Substances Act, 21 U.S.C. s. 812(c) and $\underline{s. 893.02(3)}$ $\underline{s. 893.02(4)}$.
- 2. "Weapon" means a device, instrument, material, or substance, animate or inanimate, which is used for, or is readily capable of, causing death or serious bodily injury; however, this definition does not include a pocketknife having a blade that is less than 2 1/2 inches in length.
