A bill to be entitled

An act relating to sexual assault; requiring a state university and a Florida College System institution to implement and administer various sexual assault prevention, education, and training initiatives; protecting a campus-based victim advocate from certain types of retaliation by his or her employer; requiring the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence to implement specified training programs and to monitor the campus-based victim advocacy programs' compliance with those requirements; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. A state university and a Florida College System institution shall implement and administer all of the following requirements:
- (1) (a) A campus-based victim advocacy program must operate independently from the university police and Florida College System institution police.
- (b) Communications between a campus-based victim advocate and a victim must be privileged and confidential, and a client file must be confidential.
- (c) A state university and a Florida College System institution must ensure that campus-based victim advocates complete a training program developed and conducted by the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence which includes, but is not limited to, current information on victims' rights, confidentiality, and privileges.

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(d) A campus-based victim advocate must be protected from retaliation by his or her employer for:

- 1. Maintaining the privacy and confidentiality of a client; and
- 2. Exposing a state university's or a Florida College System institution's failure to comply with the federal requirements under 20 U.S.C. ss. 1681-1688.
- (e) A state university and a Florida College System institution must negotiate and enter into memoranda of understanding with the local certified rape crisis centers and send a campus-based first responder who is a law enforcement officer or victim advocate to all community-based sexual assault response team meetings.
- (f) A state university and a Florida College System institution must implement and require all students to annually participate in an in-person sexual assault prevention training that has been demonstrated to be effective in reducing the commission of rape and that includes, but is not limited to, bystander intervention training.
- (g) University police and Florida College System institution police shall distribute the Sexual Battery Victim's Rights and Services brochure developed by the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence to all victims reporting sexual battery, as specified in s. 794.052, Florida Statutes.
- (2) The Florida Council Against Sexual Violence shall implement the training program in paragraph (1)(c) and monitor the campus-based victim advocacy programs' compliance with the requirements under paragraph (1)(c).
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
