Section 787.29, Florida Statutes, is created to 13 14 read: 787.29 Human trafficking public awareness signs.-15 16 The Department of Transportation shall display a 17 public awareness sign developed under subsection (4) in every 18 rest area, turnpike service plaza, weigh station, primary airport, passenger rail station, and welcome center in the state 19 20 which is open to the public. 21 (2) Emergency rooms shall display a public awareness sign 22 developed under subsection (4) in the emergency rooms at general 23 acute care hospitals. 24 The employer at each of the following establishments

35	8.5 inches by 11 inches in size, must be printed in at least a
36	16-point type, and must state substantially the following in

39	activity and cannot leave-whether it is prostitution,
40	housework, farm work, factory work, retail work, restaurant
41	work, or any other activity-call the National Human
42	Trafficking Resource Center at 1-888-373-7888 or text INFO
43	or HELP to 233-733 to access help and services. Victims of
44	slavery and human trafficking are protected under United
45	States and Florida law."
46	(5) The county commission may adopt an ordinance to
47	enforce subsection (3). A violation of subsection (3) is a
48	noncriminal violation and punishable by a fine only as provided
49	<u>in s. 775.083.</u>
50	Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 2016.
