Statutes, is amended to read: 627.711 Notice of premium discounts for hurricane loss mitigation; uniform mitigation verification inspection form .-The Financial Services Commission shall develop by (2) (a) rule a uniform mitigation verification inspection form that shall be used by all insurers when submitted by policyholders for the purpose of factoring discounts for wind insurance. In developing the form, the commission shall seek input from insurance, construction, and building code representatives. Further, the commission shall provide guidance as to the length of time the inspection results are valid. An insurer shall accept as valid a uniform mitigation verification form signed by the following authorized mitigation inspectors: A home inspector licensed under s. 468.8314 who has 1. completed at least 3 hours of hurricane mitigation training
