Section 1. Section 456.064, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

456.064 Conversion therapy.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term "conversion therapy" means any practice or treatment performed with the goal of changing a person's sexual orientation, including, but not limited to, efforts to change behavior, gender identity, or gender expression, or to reduce or eliminate sexual or romantic attraction or feelings toward a person of the same gender. The term does not include counseling that:
- (a) Provides support to a person actively undergoing gender transition; or

(b) Provides acceptance, support, and understanding of a person or facilitates a person's coping, social support, and identity exploration and development, including sexual orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual practices, if such counseling is not conducted with the goal of changing the person's sexual orientation or gender identity.

- (2) (a) A person who is licensed to provide professional counseling, or who performs counseling as part of his or her professional training under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 490, or chapter 491, including, but not limited to, medical practitioners, osteopathic practitioners, psychologists, psychotherapists, social workers, marriage and family therapists, and licensed counselors, may not engage in conversion therapy with a person younger than 18 years of age.
- (b) A licensed professional as described in paragraph (a) who engages in or attempts to engage in conversion therapy with a person younger than 18 years of age engages in unprofessional conduct and is subject to disciplinary proceedings by the department and the appropriate regulatory board.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
