- (d) Crab Island in Choctawhatchee Bay at the East Pass in Okaloosa County.
- (2) Notwithstanding (1), a vessel may anchor in a recreational boating zone as follows:
- (a) When a vessel suffers a mechanical failure that will pose an unreasonable risk of harm to the vessel or its occupants if the vessel does not anchor, the vessel may anchor until repaired or for 3 business days after first anchoring within the recreational boating zone, whichever occurs first.
- (b) When imminent or existing weather conditions in the vicinity of a vessel will pose an unreasonable risk of harm to the vessel or its occupants if the vessel does not anchor, the vessel may anchor until weather conditions improve to the point where operating the vessel no longer poses an unreasonable risk of harm. In the event of a hurricane or tropical storm, weather conditions are deemed to have improved to the point where operating the vessel no longer poses an unreasonable risk of harm when the hurricane or tropical storm warning affecting the area has expired.
- (c) During events described in s. 327.48 or during other special events, such as public music performances, local

- (3) This section does not apply to the following vessels:
- (a) Vessels owned or operated by a governmental entity for law enforcement, firefighting, military, or rescue purposes.
- (b) Construction or dredging vessels while on an active job site.
  - (c) Vessels actively engaged in commercial fishing.
- (d) Vessels engaged in recreational fishing if persons onboard are actively tending hook and line fishing gear or nets.
- (4) (a) A law enforcement officer or agency authorized to enforce this section pursuant to s. 327.70 may remove or cause a vessel to be removed from a recreational boating zone and impounded for up to 48 hours if an operator of the vessel, after being issued a citation for violating this section:
- Anchors the vessel in violation of this section within
   hours after being issued the citation; or
- 2. Refuses to weigh anchor and get underway after being directed to do so by a law enforcement officer.
- (b) In addition to the civil penalty imposed under s. 327.73(1)(y), a person whose vessel is removed and impounded pursuant to paragraph (a) shall pay all removal and storage charges before the vessel is released.
- (c) A law enforcement officer or agency acting under this subsection to remove or impound a vessel or cause to be removed

- or impounded a vessel anchored in violation of this section
  shall be held harmless for all damages to the vessel resulting
  from such removal or impoundment unless the damage results from
  gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- (d) A contractor performing removal or impoundment activities at the direction of a law enforcement officer or agency pursuant to this subsection must be licensed in accordance with applicable United States Coast Guard regulations where required; obtain and carry in full force and effect a policy from a licensed insurance carrier in this state to insure against any accident, loss, injury, property damage, or other casualty caused by or resulting from the contractor's actions; and be properly equipped to perform the services to be provided.
- (5) A violation of this section is punishable as provided in s. 327.73(1)(y).
- Section 2. Paragraph (y) is added to subsection (1) of section 327.73, Florida Statutes, to read:
  - 327.73 Noncriminal infractions.
- (1) Violations of the following provisions of the vessel laws of this state are noncriminal infractions:
- (y) Section 327.4107, relating to the anchoring of vessels in recreational boating zones, for which the penalty is:
  - 1. For a first offense, up to a maximum of \$50.
  - 2. For a second offense, up to a maximum of \$100.
- 3. For a third or subsequent offense, up to a maximum of \$250.

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Any person cited for a violation of any provision of this subsection shall be deemed to be charged with a noncriminal infraction, shall be cited for such an infraction, and shall be cited to appear before the county court. The civil penalty for any such infraction is \$50, except as otherwise provided in this section. Any person who fails to appear or otherwise properly respond to a uniform boating citation shall, in addition to the charge relating to the violation of the boating laws of this state, be charged with the offense of failing to respond to such citation and, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. A written warning to this effect shall be provided at the time such uniform boating citation is issued.
