An act relating to process and service of process; amending s. 48.031, F.S.; providing for service of process when the only address discoverable through public records for a person to be served is a virtual office or an executive or mini office suite; providing definitions; amending s. 48.081, F.S.; conforming a provision; amending s. 48.193, F.S.; providing that orders issued by agencies of other states are not enforceable in certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (6) of section 48.031, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

 48.031 Service of process generally; service of witness subpoenas.—

(6) (a) If the only address for a person to be served, which is discoverable through public records, is a private mailbox, a virtual office, or an executive or mini office suite, substitute service may be made by leaving a copy of the process with the person in charge of the private mailbox, virtual office, or executive or mini office suite, but only if the process server determines that the person to be served maintains a mailbox, a virtual office, or an executive or mini office

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(b) As used in this subsection, the term "virtual office"
means an office that provides communication and address services
without providing any dedicated office space, and the term
"executive or mini office suite" means an office that provides

"executive or mini office suite" means an office that provides

communication, dedicated office space, and other support

services. In both types of offices, all communication is routed

through a common receptionist.

Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 48.081, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

48.081 Service on corporation.

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(b) If the address for the registered agent, officer, director, or principal place of business is a residence, a exprivate mailbox, a virtual office, or an executive or mini office suite, service on the corporation may be made by serving the registered agent, officer, or director in accordance with s. 48.031.

Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 48.193, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

48.193 Acts subjecting person to jurisdiction of courts of state.—

(1)

(b) Notwithstanding any provision of this subsection,  $\underline{an}$  order issued, or a penalty or fine imposed, by an agency of any other state  $\underline{is}$  shall not be enforceable against any person or

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entity incorporated or having its principal place of business in this state  $\underline{if}$  where such other state does not provide a mandatory right of review of such agency decision in a state court of competent jurisdiction.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.

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
