An act relating to private security services; providing a short title; amending s. 493.6303, F.S.; requiring an applicant for licensure as an armed security officer to complete substance abuse and mental illness coursework and provide a statement from a mental health professional; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Kijuan Byrd and Michael Smathers Act."

Section 2. Subsection (5) of section 493.6303, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

493.6303 License requirements. - In addition to the license requirements set forth elsewhere in this chapter, each individual or agency must comply with the following additional requirements:

- (5) An applicant for a Class "G" license shall:
- (a) Satisfy the firearms training outlined in s. 493.6115.
- (b) Successfully complete substance abuse and mental illness coursework at a school or training facility licensed by the department. The department shall establish by rule the general content and number of hours for such coursework.
- (c) Provide a statement from a mental health professional licensed in this state attesting that the applicant has been evaluated and does not have a mental illness.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
