thereof authorized to expend public funds for construction, maintenance, repair, or improvement of public works.

- (b) "Public works project" means an activity that is paid for in whole or in part with state funds and that consists of the construction, maintenance, repair, renovation, remodeling, or improvement of a building, road, street, sewer, storm drain, water system, site development, irrigation system, reclamation project, gas or electrical distribution system, gas or electrical substation, or other facility, project, or portion thereof that is owned in whole or in part by any political subdivision. The term does not include a contract executed under chapter 337.
- (2) (a) Except as required by federal or state law, the state or any political subdivision that contracts for a public works project may not require that a contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier engaged in such project:
- 1. Pay employees a predetermined amount of wages or prescribe any wage rate;
- 2. Provide employees a specified type, amount, or rate of employee benefits;
 - 3. Control, limit, or expand staffing; or
- 4. Recruit, train, or hire employees from a designated, restricted, or single source.
- (b) The state or any political subdivision that contracts for a public works project may not prohibit any contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier able to perform
