## ARTICLE X

## MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 29. Hydraulic fracturing.-

- (a) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term
  "hydraulic fracturing" means any process that expands existing
  fractures or creates new fractures in a rock formation by
  injecting fluids into or underneath the surface of the rock
  formation for the purpose of exploring for or producing oil or
  natural gas resources.
- (b) PROHIBITION.—Hydraulic fracturing is prohibited in the State of Florida.
- (c) ENFORCEMENT.—A person aggrieved by a violation of this section may bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction. The state attorney general may bring a civil action to enforce this section. Upon prevailing, a person brining the action shall be awarded reasonable attorney fees and

costs. An action to enforce this section is subject to a statute of limitations of four years.

- (d) PENALTY.—A person who violates this section is subject to a fine payable to the state in the amount of \$10,000 for each violation. Each day a violation continues constitutes a separate violation.
- (e) LIABILITY.—A person who violates this section is liable for any damage caused to the air, waters, or real property, including animal, plant, or aquatic life, and for reasonable costs and expenses in tracing the source of the discharge, in controlling and abating the source and the pollutants, and in restoring the air, waters, and real property, including animal, plant, and aquatic life.
- (f) IMPLEMENTATION.—Implementing legislation is not required in order to enforce this amendment.
