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 10 If a person has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or a
 11 dementia-related disorder, this condition must be indicated in
 12 the ex parte order, written report, or certificate. When
 13 initiating transport of such person, a law enforcement officer
 14 shall collect any information regarding his or her condition,
 15 medications, and needs provided by a health professional, family
 16 member, caregiver, or other individual, and shall provide this
 17 to the receiving facility immediately upon arrival. As soon as

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18 practicable, such person shall be temporarily placed in a secure
19 private area within the receiving facility, if available, and
20 clinically indicated, where the person shall be permitted to be
21 accompanied by a family member or caregiver provided it is safe
22 for him or her to do so.

31 information and provide that information to the receiving
32 facility; allowing for temporary placement in a secure area
33 within the receiving facility for persons with Alzheimer's
34 disease or a dementia-related disorder under certain
35 circumstances;
