Right to bear arms.-18 19 The right of the people to keep and bear arms in (a) defense of themselves and of the lawful authority of the state 20 21 shall not be infringed, except that the manner of bearing arms may be regulated by law. 22 (b) There shall be a mandatory period of three days, 23 24 excluding weekends and legal holidays, between the purchase and 25 delivery at retail of any handgun. section, "purchase" means the transfer of money or other valuable consideration to the retailer, and "handgun" means a firearm capable of being carried and used by one hand, such as a pistol or revolver. Holders of a concealed weapon permit <u>and law</u> <u>enforcement officers</u> as prescribed in Florida law shall not be subject to the provisions of this paragraph.

32 (c) The legislature shall enact legislation implementing 33 subsection (b) of this section, effective no later than December 34 31, 1991, which shall provide that anyone violating the 35 provisions of subsection (b) shall be guilty of a felony.

36 (d) This restriction shall not apply to a trade in of37 another handgun.

SECTION 5. Local option.-

Local option on the legality or prohibition of the 41 (a) 42 sale of intoxicating liquors, wines or beers shall be preserved 43 to each county. The status of a county with respect thereto 44 shall be changed only by vote of the electors in a special 45 election called upon the petition of twenty-five per cent of the 46 electors of the county, and not sooner than two years after an earlier election on the same question. Where legal, the sale of 47 intoxicating liquors, wines and beers shall be regulated by law. 48

excluding weekends and legal holidays, in connection with the sale of any firearm occurring within such county. For purposes of this subsection, the term "sale" means the transfer of money

or other valuable consideration for any firearm when any part of the transaction is conducted on property to which the public has the right of access. Holders of a concealed weapons permit <u>and</u> <u>law enforcement officers</u> as prescribed by general law shall not be subject to the provisions of this subsection when purchasing a firearm.
