time the initial confinement, abduction, restraint, or
imprisonment occurred, the applicable period of limitation does
not begin to run until the victim has reached the age of 18 or
the victim's liberty has been restored, whichever occurs later.
This paragraph applies to an offense that is not otherwise
barred from prosecution on or before the effective date of this
act.
Section 2. The Division of Law Revision and Information is
directed to replace the phrase "the effective date of this act"
wherever it occurs in this act with the date the act becomes a
law.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
