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members of the state group health insurance program with access to the following services:

- 1. Primary care services, including walk-in, consultative, and urgent care services.
 - 2. Medication dispensing.

- 3. Wellness services, including online tools and services, health risk assessments and recommendations, health and wellness information mailings, health fairs, wellness screenings, and onsite education.
- 4. Occupational health services, including return-to-work planning, new hire and emergent drug screening, and injury care.
- 5. Administration of vaccines and immunizations, including influenza virus immunizations.
 - 6. Access to and management of electronic medical records.
- (c) The vendor is not required to file insurance claims, including medical, health, and workers' compensation claims, for any service provided by the clinics.
- (d) At least one program clinic shall provide laboratory services and may offer optional digital radiology services and prenatal support services for pregnant employees.
- (e) The program shall begin no later than January 1, 2018.

 One clinic shall be established at the Southwood Complex and shall operate for no more than 40 hours per week. The other clinic shall be established in Miami-Dade County and shall operate for no less than 40 hours per week. The hours of

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operation for the two clinics shall be mutually exclusive. The location of the clinics shall be on property owned by the state and shall be provided at no cost to the vendor.

- vendor shall be for no more than 5 years. By February 1, 2018, and by February 1 of each of the remaining 4 years that the program is in effect, the department shall submit a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives that evaluates the extent to which the vendor has:
- 1. Implemented comprehensive health and wellness services for state employees.
- 2. Leveraged group purchasing power to provide comprehensive health and wellness services.
- 3. Distributed health and wellness information and health education materials.
 - 4. Maintained consistent standards for quality of care.
- 5. Achieved cost savings as a result of state employees' use of clinic services.
- 6. Achieved and guaranteed employee engagement and satisfaction.
- 7. Achieved a positive return on investment with the vendor having no more than 10 percent of the contract at risk.
