35	prohibit autonomous technology from being deemed the operator of
36	an autonomous vehicle operating in autonomous mode and does not
37	require a licensed human operator to operate an autonomous

39	319.145(1).
40	(b) The requirements of chapter 322 do not apply if an
41	autonomous vehicle is operated in autonomous mode without a
42	human operator physically present in the vehicle.
43	(c) Sections 316.062, 316.063, and 316.065 do not apply to
