2	An act relating to criminal offenses involving tombs
3	and memorials; amending s. 872.02, F.S.; providing
4	that a person who willfully and knowingly excavates,
5	exposes, moves, or removes the contents of a grave or
6	tomb commits a felony; revising applicability;
7	authorizing an owner, officer, employee, or agent of
8	specified cemeteries to relocate the contents of a
9	grave or tomb, subject to certain conditions;
10	providing an effective date.
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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Section 872.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to
15	read:
16	872.02 Injuring or removing tomb or monument; disturbing
17	contents of grave or tomb; penalties
18	(1) A person commits a felony of the third degree,
19	punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084
20	if he or she:
21	(a) who Willfully and knowingly destroys, mutilates,
22	defaces, injures, or removes any tomb, monument, gravestone,
23	burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human
24	skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other
25	structure or thing placed or designed for a memorial of the
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dead, or any fence, railing, curb, or other thing intended for the protection or ornamentation of any tomb, monument, gravestone, burial mound, earthen or shell monument containing human skeletal remains or associated burial artifacts, or other structure before mentioned, or for any enclosure for the burial of the dead; r or

32 (b) Willfully destroys, mutilates, removes, cuts, breaks, 33 or injures any tree, shrub, or plant placed or being within any 34 such enclosure, <u>except for a person performing routine</u> 35 <u>maintenance and upkeep</u> commits a felony of the third degree, 36 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

37 (2) A person who willfully and knowingly <u>excavates</u>,
38 <u>exposes</u>, moves, removes, or otherwise disturbs the contents of a
39 tomb or grave <u>or tomb</u> commits a felony of the second degree,
40 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

This section does shall not apply to any person acting 41 (3)42 under the direction or authority of the Division of Historical 43 Resources of the Department of State, to cemeteries operating 44 under chapter 497, any cemeteries removing or relocating the 45 contents of a grave or tomb as a response to a natural disaster, 46 or to any person otherwise authorized by law to remove or 47 disturb a tomb, monument, gravestone, burial mound, or similar structure, or its contents, as described in subsection (1). 48

49 (4) For purposes of this section, the term "tomb" includes50 any mausoleum, columbarium, or belowground crypt.

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51	(5) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), an owner,
52	officer, employee, or agent of a cemetery exempt from regulation
53	pursuant to s. 497.260 may relocate the contents of a grave or
54	tomb:
55	(a) After receiving a written authorization from a legally
56	authorized person as defined in s. 497.005(43); or
57	(b) After public notice is posted as required in this
58	paragraph, if a legally authorized person cannot be located
59	after conducting a reasonable search or after 75 years or more
60	have elapsed since the date of entombment, interment, or
61	inurnment. The public notice must be published once a week for 4
62	consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the
63	county where the cemetery is located. The public notice must
64	contain the name of the cemetery; the name, address, and
65	telephone number of the cemetery representative with whom
66	objections may be filed; the reason for relocation of the
67	contents of the graves or tombs; the names of the human remains
68	to be relocated; the approximate date of the initial entombment,
69	interment, or inurnment; the proposed site of relocation; and
70	the proposed date of relocation. The proposed date of relocation
71	may not be less than 30 days from last date of publication. If
72	no objection from a legally authorized person is received within
73	30 days from the last date of publication of the public notice,
74	the cemetery may proceed with relocation.
75	(6) If a legally authorized person refuses to sign a
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76	written authorization, as provided in (5)(a), or if a legally
77	authorized person objects, as provided in (5)(b), a public
78	hearing shall be held before the county commission of the county
79	where the cemetery is located, or the city council, if the
80	cemetery is located in a municipality, and the county commission
81	or the city council shall have the authority to grant a request
82	for relocation of the contents of such graves or tombs.
83	Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
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
