26 <u>baccalaureate degree program within 4 years.</u> The excess hour 27 surcharge shall become effective for students who enter a state 28 university for the first time and maintain continuous enrollment 29 as follows:

30 (a) For the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 academic years, an
31 excess hour surcharge equal to 50 percent of the tuition rate
32 for each credit hour in excess of 120 percent.

33 (b) For the 2011-2012 academic year, an excess hour 34 surcharge equal to 100 percent of the tuition rate for each 35 credit hour in excess of 115 percent.

36 (c) For the 2012-2013 academic year and thereafter, an 37 excess hour surcharge equal to 100 percent of the tuition rate 38 for each credit hour in excess of 110 percent.

39 (4) For purposes of this section, credit hours earned
40 under the following circumstances are not calculated as hours
41 required to earn a baccalaureate degree:

(i) Credit hours earned in upper-division-level courses that must be repeated to meet the requirements for a baccalaureate degree in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics discipline.
