15	1003.4282, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

18	(8) CAREER EDUCATION COURSES THAT SATISFY HIGH SCHOOL							
19	CREDIT REQUIREMENTS							
20	(a) Participation in career education courses engages							
21	students in their high school education, increases academic							
22	achievement, enhances employability, and increases postsecondary							
23	success. By July 1, 2014, the department shall develop, for							
24	approval by the State Board of Education, multiple, additional							
25	career education courses or a series of courses that meet the							
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26 requirements set forth in s. 1003.493(2), (4), and (5) and this 27 subsection and allow students to earn credit in both the career 28 education course and courses required for high school graduation 29 under this section and s. 1003.4281.

The state board must determine if sufficient academic
standards are covered to warrant the award of academic credit.

32 2. Career education courses must include workforce and 33 digital literacy skills and the integration of required course content with practical applications and designated rigorous 34 coursework that results in one or more industry certifications 35 or clearly articulated credit or advanced standing in a 2-year 36 37 or 4-year certificate or degree program, which may include high school junior and senior year work-related internships or 38 39 apprenticeships. The department shall negotiate state licenses 40 for material and testing for industry certifications. The instructional methodology used in these courses must be 41 42 comprised of authentic projects, problems, and activities for 43 contextually learning the academics.

<u>A student who earns credit upon completion of an</u>
<u>apprenticeship or preapprenticeship program registered with the</u>
<u>Department of Education under chapter 446 may use such credit to</u>
<u>satisfy the high school graduation credit requirements in</u>
<u>paragraphs (3) (e) and (g). The state board shall approve and</u>
<u>identify in the Course Code Directory the apprenticeship and</u>
<u>preapprenticeship programs from which earned credit may be used</u>
