WHEREAS, as educators, authors, community leaders and activists, musicians, and politicians, Caribbean-Americans have made their mark on every facet of our society and have contributed to the betterment and diversity of our state and nation, and

20 WHEREAS, counted among the many famous sons and daughters 21 of the Caribbean are activist W. E. B. Du Bois; Secretary of the 22 Treasury Alexander Hamilton; the first African-American 23 Secretary of State, Colin Powell; actress Cicely Tyson; actor 24 Sidney Poitier, the first African-American actor to receive the 25 Academy Award for Best Actor in a Leading Role; author, poet, 26 and civil rights activist James Weldon Johnson; musician, actor, 27 and activist Harry Belafonte; athlete Roberto Clemente, the 28 first Latino inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame; 29 and numerous others who have displayed great strength and 30 resiliency while serving as pioneers among the people of the 31 Caribbean, and
