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Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that information received by the Department of State, pursuant to an interstate agreement entered into under s. 98.075(2)(b), Florida Statutes, from another state that is confidential or exempt pursuant to the laws of that state be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Participating in interstate agreements to share and exchange information with other states in order to verify voter registration information is critical to ensuring the accuracy of the statewide voter registration system. Maintaining an accurate statewide voter registration system is critical to fair elections in this state. Without the public records exemption, the department will be unable to receive information from other states that might otherwise be confidential or exempt pursuant to the laws of those states, which would impair the ability of the department and supervisors of elections to maintain accurate voter rolls. As a result, the effective and efficient administration of the statewide voter registration system would be hindered.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that CS/HB 707 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
