## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 312 and 313

insert:

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Section 5. The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) shall conduct a study of current federal and state efforts on, and available opportunities for, the collecting, sharing, and donating of electronic health records before or after a patient's death for the advancement of medical science. OPPAGA shall identify



available options regarding databases or repositories that will allow for the collection and distribution of donated electronic health records for the purpose of advancing the current state of medicine, including any existing public or private databases or repositories and any available opportunities for public or private funding to establish such a database or repository. OPPAGA shall also study the donation of electronic health records to identify any existing state or federal legislation or programs that allow such donations and to identify the benefits of, and barriers to, establishing such programs in the state of Florida. OPPAGA shall report its findings and recommendations for an electronic health records donation process to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than December 1, 2017.
