degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$5,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 60 days. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for 6 months.

- 2. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$10,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 12 months. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for 12 months.
- 3. A third and any subsequent violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of \$10,000 and a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 90 days, not to exceed 12 months. In addition, the commission shall permanently revoke all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter.
- 4. During the period of suspension or revocation of license privileges imposed under this paragraph, the violator may not participate in the taking or harvesting, or attempt the taking or harvesting, of saltwater products from any vessel within the waters of the state; be aboard any vessel on which a commercial quantity of saltwater products is possessed through an activity requiring a license pursuant to this chapter; or engage in any other activity requiring a license, permit, or certificate issued pursuant to this chapter.
 - (b) Upon conviction of a violation of this section, any

other person shall be punished as follows:

- 1. A first violation is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 60 days. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for 60 days.
- 2. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a fine of not more than \$10,000 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 12 months. In addition, the commission shall suspend all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter for 12 months.
- 3. A third and any subsequent violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a mandatory fine of not less than \$5,000, but not more than \$10,000, and a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 90 days, not to exceed 12 months. In addition, the commission shall permanently revoke all of the violator's license privileges under this chapter.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
