The plate 23 24 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The 25 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the

words "Sun Sea Smiles" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed as follows:
- 1. Five percent shall be distributed to the Florida
 Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc., to be used only for
 marketing of the Sun Sea Smiles license plate.
- 2. An additional 30 percent shall be distributed to the Florida Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the remainder shall be used as follows:
- a. Sixty percent shall be used for a college scholarship program.
- b. Fifteen percent shall be used to promote health and wellness for residents in this state who are of Caribbean descent.
- c. Twenty-five percent shall be used to promote awareness of Caribbean culture within this state.
- 3. Twenty percent shall be distributed to the American Friends of Jamaica, Inc., a charitable, not-for-profit organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code registered with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and incorporated in New York, to be used as grants to promote social and community development among residents of this state. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative and marketing expenses.
