6 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 110.12315, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 123 of chapter 2016-62 and section 1 of chapter 2016-9 224, Laws of Florida, is amended to read:

10 110.12315 Prescription drug program.-The state employees' 11 prescription drug program is established. This program shall be 12 administered by the Department of Management Services, according 13 to the terms and conditions of the plan as established by the relevant provisions of the annual General Appropriations Act and 14 implementing legislation, subject to the following conditions: 15

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(1) The department shall allow prescriptions written by
health care providers under the plan to be filled by any
licensed pharmacy <u>and reimbursed</u> pursuant to <u>subsection (2)</u>
contractual claims-processing provisions. Nothing in this
section may be construed as prohibiting a mail order
prescription drug program distinct from the service provided by
retail pharmacies.

(2) In providing for reimbursement of pharmacies for
prescription <u>drugs and supplies</u> medicines dispensed to members
of the state group health insurance plan and their dependents
under the state employees' prescription drug program:

(a) Retail, mail order, and specialty pharmacies
participating in the program must be reimbursed at a <u>rate</u>
<u>established by contract and uniform rate and subject to uniform</u>
conditions, according to the terms and conditions of the plan.

(b) There shall be a 30-day supply limit for <u>retail</u> <u>pharmacy fills and a</u> prescription card purchases and 90-day supply limit for mail order <u>fills and fills by retail pharmacies</u> <u>participating in the 90-day supply network</u> or mail order prescription drug purchases.

36 (c) The current pharmacy dispensing fee shall be

38 (d) The department shall establish the reimbursement 39 schedule for prescription drugs and supplies dispensed under the 40 program. The reimbursement rate for a prescription drug or

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41	supply must be based on the cost of the generic equivalent drug

44	prescribing the drug or supply clearly states on the

57	(a) Preferred provider organization health plan members
58	may have prescriptions for maintenance drugs and supplies filled
59	up to three times as an up to 30-day supply through a retail
60	pharmacy; thereafter, prescriptions for the same maintenance
61	drug or supply must be filled as an up to 90-day supply either
62	through the department's contracting mail order pharmacy or
63	through a participating 90-day retail pharmacy.
64	(b) Health maintenance organization health plan members
65	may have prescriptions for maintenance drugs and supplies filled
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66	as an up to 90-day supply either through a mail order pharmacy
67	or through a participating 90-day retail pharmacy.
68	(5) Copayments made by health plan members for an up to
69	90-day supply through a participating 90-day retail pharmacy
70	shall be the same as copayments made for an up to 90-day supply
71	through the contracting mail order pharmacy.
72	(6) The department shall conduct a prescription
73	utilization review program. In order to participate in the state
74	employees' prescription drug program, retail pharmacies
75	dispensing prescription medicines to members of the state group
76	health insurance plan or their covered dependents, or to
77	subscribers or covered dependents of a health maintenance
78	organization plan under the state group insurance program, shall
79	make their records available for this review.
80	(7) The department shall implement the following cost-
81	saving measures which shall not restrict access to the most
82	clinically appropriate, clinically effective, and lowest net
83	cost prescription drugs and supplies:
84	(a) Formulary management. Prescription drugs and supplies
85	shall be subject to formulary inclusion and exclusion.
86	Prescription drugs and supplies that are excluded may be made
87	available to an individual member or her or his dependent for
88	inclusion by medical necessity review.
89	(b) Adjustments as may be required to balance program
90	funding within appropriations provided.
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91 (3) The Department of Management Services shall establish the reimbursement schedule for prescription pharmaceuticals 92 93 dispensed under the program. Reimbursement rates for a prescription pharmaceutical must be based on the cost of the 94 95 generic equivalent drug if a generic equivalent exists, unless 96 the physician, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or physician assistant prescribing the pharmaceutical clearly 97 states on the prescription that the brand name drug is medically 98 necessary or that the drug product is included on the formulary 99 100 of drug products that may not be interchanged as provided in 101 chapter 465, in which case reimbursement must be based on the 102 cost of the brand name drug as specified in the reimbursement 103 schedule adopted by the Department of Management Services. 104 (4) The Department of Management Services shall conduct a 105 prescription utilization review program. In order to participate 106 in the state employees' prescription drug program, retail 107 pharmacies dispensing prescription medicines to members of the 108 state group health insurance plan or their covered dependents, 109 or to subscribers or covered dependents of a health maintenance

110 organization plan under the state group insurance program, shall
111 make their records available for this review.

112 (5) The Department of Management Services shall implement 113 such additional cost-saving measures and adjustments as may be 114 required to balance program funding within appropriations 115 provided, including a trial or starter dose program and

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116	dispensing of long-term-maintenance medication in lieu of acute
117	therapy medication.
118	<u>(8)</u> Participating pharmacies must use a point-of-sale
119	device or an online computer system to verify a participant's
120	eligibility for coverage. The state is not liable for
121	reimbursement of a participating pharmacy for dispensing
122	prescription drugs and supplies to any person whose current
123	eligibility for coverage has not been verified by the state's
124	contracted administrator or by the Department of Management
125	Services.
126	(9) (7) Under the state employees' prescription drug
127	program copayments must be made as follows:
128	(a) Effective <u>July 1, 2017</u> January 1, 2006 , for the State

Section 8 of Chapter 99-255, Laws of Florida, 171 is amended to read: Section 8. The Department of Management Services shall not 172 173 implement a prior authorization program or a restricted 174 formulary program that restricts a non-HMO enrollee's access to 175 prescription drugs beyond the provisions of paragraph (b) 176 related specifically to generic equivalents for prescriptions 177 and the provisions in paragraph (d) related specifically to 178 starter dose programs or the dispensing of long-term maintenance 179 medications. The prior authorization program expanded pursuant to section 8 of the 1998-1999 General Appropriations Act is 180 181 hereby terminated. If this section conflicts with any General 182 Appropriations Act or any act implementing a General 183 Appropriations Act, the Legislature intends that the provisions 184 of this section shall prevail. This section shall take effect 185 upon becoming law. 186 Section 3.
